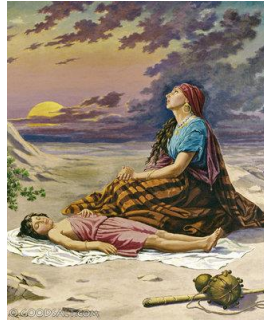

Have you ever considered the fact that the Bible contains what might be some quite radical and modern views of women? Throughout Scripture we see how God reaches down, offers us a helping hand, and then puts us right where He wants us.



In Genesis 21, we find the account of how Hagar's desperate prayer for water revealed how God cares for us physically, and how He faithfully will provide for our needs.

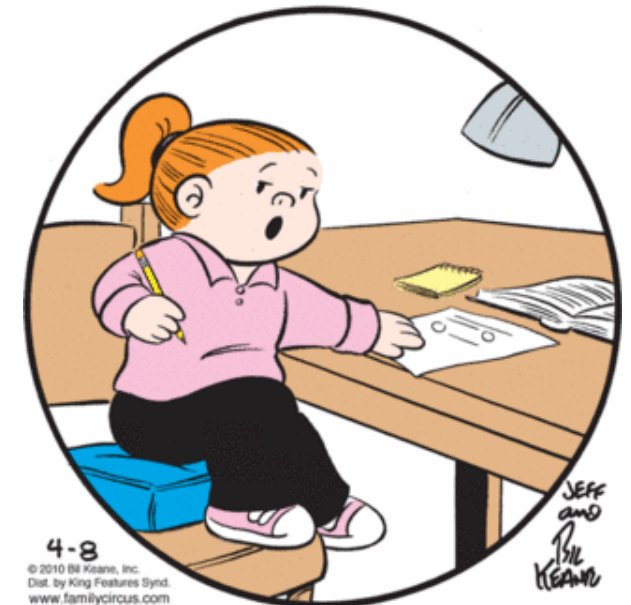
