FALL SAFETY TIPS:

As the weather gets cooler your pups will enjoy being outside more, but instead of the sun there are other hazards to worry about.

- Campfires and Firewood: Can cause burns and intestinal blockage if ingested.
- Mushrooms: Some mushrooms are highly toxic and can cause life-threatening problems in pets.
- Corn cobs: If ingested can cause intestinal blockage.
- Snakes: Snakes are preparing for hibernation and may be more active. Know which venomous snakes are in our area and what to do if a bite occurs.
- Apples: Apples are great for dogs, but apple cores and seeds can be toxic and cause intestinal blockages.
- Antifreeze: As temperatures drop, antifreeze spills become more common. Antifreeze is highly toxic to pets, even in small amounts.
- Rodenticides: Cooler weather often leads to increased use of rodenticides to control pests. These substances are extremely toxic to pets if ingested.

Enjoy the crisp weather with your furry friends, but always be vigilant and prepared to keep them safe and healthy.

INTRODUCING NEW EXPERIENCES:

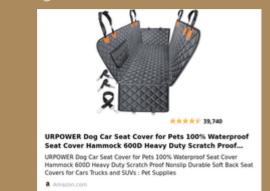

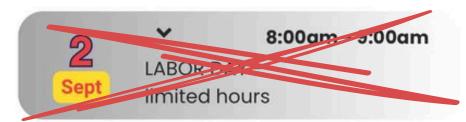
