His motto, “All Vet Lives Matter” is not just a phrase; it is a statement that our focus is to ensure all veterans receive the support and treatment for their health care needs. This year the MOC and MOCA will once again support the Big Boot Program, a suicide awareness program designed to reduce the veteran suicide rate. Commonly referred to “22 a day”, the boot is a symbol used to show veterans they are not alone; we will walk with them through their journey to recovery. The monies raised for this project will be kept local and given to agencies that help veterans with mental health awareness and suicide prevention. The National Home Projects are Bee Hive Training and Regenerative Agriculture which provide conservation and rehabilitation approaches to food and farming systems. It focuses on top-soil regeneration and bee pollination as beacons of hope for restoring ecosystems while enhancing farming productivity. The auxiliary is poised to promote these programs along with our nursing home and hospital visitations. Our fall projects include “Sweats for Vets” and “Adopt a Veteran Holiday Food Totes”.
