

Battlestar Galactica Models Review

"Fleeing the Cylon Tyranny, the last Battlestar, Galactica, leads a rag-tag fugitive fleet on a lonely quest; for a shining planet known as Earth!"

This line was the line that followed at the end of every episode of the sci-fi series Battlestar Galactica in 1978; enticing the viewer to tune in next week for an exciting new episode. I was one of those that did faithfully. I owned the toys, the books, the trading cards from Topps and Wonder

Bread; everything I could get my hands on! This includes the models produced by Monogram in 1978 as well. They

were VERY basic; no interiors and very little detailing, but they were all we had. The series vanished into obscurity in 1979 until it was "reimagined" for production in 2004. The new series was much darker and had better special effects. But I still preferred the old one.

Moebius Models began producing some very nicely made models of the new series and then branched into remaking ones from the old series as well!!! You can imagine my excitement when I saw them! This is about two models; one from the old show and the other from the new version.....

The first kit is the Battlestar Galactica in 1/4105 scale. It is

based on the new series but still retains a similar look to the old in general configuration. The kit was molded in a fine gray plastic that, to me, almost seemed resin like; but it had excellent detail and very little to no flashing. The instruction booklet took you meticulously through each step; with little tips learned from experience along the way. If you follow the instructions, you will have no problems. Assembly went together really well and there were hardly any seams to clean up. Some of the smaller parts were fragile and care needed to be taken in getting

them off the sprues.

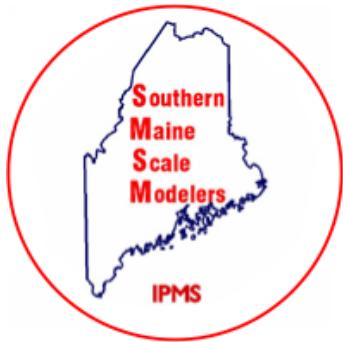
Painting the kit was fun; as it required a variety of metallic



finishes and some minor weathering. Once it was done, Moebius gives you a little insignia stand and a metal rod to place it on. If you wish to do more than out of box, there are even sets of photoetch and lighting kits available. I chose (as usual) to build it out of box.

All in all, although I wasn't a huge fan of the new show, I AM a fan of their ships and the kits that Moebius has produced for it! One a scale of 1-10, I give them a solid 8!!! As I stated above, Moebius also brought back the ships from the old 1978 series. In my opinion, they are WAY

One member stated that disgruntled members leaving and rejoining the club to cause discontent brings up the option to vote a member out of the club. The club chose to discuss this option, and at this time the member said he would leave so it would not be necessary.

The discussion continued regarding removing the member. A motion was made and seconded to have the member removed from our club membership. Votes were 12 for, 1 against, 3 abstained. Motion passed and the member has been removed from the membership.

Alfred and having the Texas Roadhouse cater the event at the museum.


The Club Theme for February 2026 is Helicopters




ABOVE those that were produced by Monogram over 50 years ago. Firstly, the combat fighters are now the same scale to each other, and they have interiors! The plastic is of excellent quality and my Viper Mk 1 kit had no flash to

clean up and great detailing. They even provided clear parts for lighting it up if you wished! It went together like a dream! Assembly was excellent yet again and I had no noticeable seams to fill or repair; just a light sanding removed them. Painting the kit was pretty straightforward and the instruction sheet gave you most of what you needed to know. The decals were excellent and laid down very nicely. I distressed mine some to allow for showing wear and tear and they took it like a champ. There was no need for a display stand; as the kit had some great detailed landing gear. Moebius has really done a great job capturing these really cool ships of a by-gone era! I wholeheartedly recommend them!!! This one I give a 9 out of 10!!!










Finished with DupliColor primer, gloss and flat black
