

What does the Architectural Review Committee do?

Or better yet, "Why would I ever need an Architectural Review Committee?"

In short, the ARC (Architectural Review Committee) tries to maintain the aesthetic quality of the neighborhood - which sounds way too officious.

We review proposed changes that owners want to make to their homes or landscaping. After receiving approval, with the makeover can proceed.

How do you go about getting approval of architectural or landscape changes?

1. Decide what you need to do for the exterior of your home or landscaping (we can't help you with that.) Please refer to the Architectural Design Manual (available on-line).
2. Get an Architectural Review form from the Goose Hollow Webpage - www.goosehollowhoa.org/gh-hoa-forms.html
- or, walk over to the Tukwila office and ask for the form.
3. Fill out the form. Include a sketch of the change, or include samples of the paint colors you have chosen.
4. Talk to your neighbors about the changes you are making.
5. Turn in the form to the Tukwila office. You probably know when the office is open by now (on the corner of Tukwila and Hazelnut Drives).
6. The filled out form will be given to the ARC.
7. We review the proposed changes.
8. The office will send an approval letter so you can begin.

Let's say you want to build a fence. There are so many choices when considering fences.
