

LEILANI ESTATES NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH MEETING MINUTES – November 29, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm by Greg Armstrong.

No Community Police Officers were in attendance and no crime statistics were available.

The October 25th Neighborhood Watch Meeting Minutes were provided as handouts and reviewed by those attending. Mark made the motion to approve the October minutes and Jim seconded the motion. All attending were in favor.

Roberta gave the Treasury Report, indicating a balance of \$2,436.64 as of 11/28/16. Jay made the motion to approve the Treasury Report, Mark seconded the motion and all attending approved.

Roberta noted that one new LENW volunteer driver signed up this month. Several shifts opened up this month to replace volunteer drivers who moved or could no longer commit to their shifts. Also, Bob Moody invited a new volunteer to the meeting and he has been riding with Bob on his weekly shift.

Mark noted that the next albizia project will be on December 10th at 9:00 am in conjunction with the Big Island Invasive Species group.

Richard presented the November Loose Dog Report, indicating that 10 dogs were sighted or reported off-leash, 8 were photographed, 1 complaint was filed and there was 1 verbal warning. In November 3 First Warning Notices were sent and there were no Second or Third Violations. Two sightings of problem dogs (3 or more violations) off-leash were reported to HIHS this month.

Greg announced that there will be another treatment for Little Fire Ants around the LCA Park on December 5th at 10:00 am. The Big Island Invasive Species group will return in January to offer training again.

There was some discussion about donating \$\$ from LENW funds to the Food Basket as part of our commitment of giving back to the community – either a monetary donation or purchasing a quantity of paper bags with handles. The least expensive paper bags are available at Costco (\$30 for 300 bags). The group recommended a donation of 900 bags to the food distribution effort at this time.
