Roth took questions from attendees involving the following subjects: Improvements in crime rates in Leilani Estates; Bail and why people get out of jail; Overcrowding of our jails; Taxpayer cost of incarceration; Recent trends in criminal activity; Programs for juvenile offenders and kids with incarcerated parents; Responsibility of a landlord concerning property with criminal activity; Justifiable use of deadly force in self defense; and How to get rid of squatters.
