

LEILANI ESTATES NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH MEETING MINUTES – April 30, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Greg Armstrong.

Police Officer Cardines said the crime statistics report was not yet available for this month. He indicated that burglaries are down for the month, 1 or 2 in Leilani Estates and a couple of domestic disputes. Many more calls are coming in from Orchidland and HPP. Leilani Estates is a role model he uses when meeting with other communities. Some questions have been raised concerning the legalities of the road barriers used by Leilani Estates Home Owners Association. He is currently working with the court council for clarification. He said several known criminals have left Leilani Estates and are hiding out in other neighborhoods or in prison. Officer Cardines indicated he has been working with Council Women Ashley Kierkewic concerning the Leilani resident known as Jungle George. Continue to report his violations to police. With enough citations and arrests he will eventually get the mental health assistance he needs. Cardines has also warned the bus companies that “No Parking” and “Keep Out” signs will be enforced at the lava flow streets and citations have been issued.

The March 26, 2019 Neighborhood Watch Meeting Minutes were provided as handouts and reviewed by those attending. Jim Penny moved to accept the minutes. Motion was seconded by James Tucker. All attending were in favor. Motion carried.

Greg Armstrong gave the Treasury Report, indicating a balance of \$1808.89 as of (April 30, 2019). James Tucker made the motion to approve the Treasury Report, Richard Skidmore seconded the motion and all attending were in favor. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Squatter/Trespasser Committee: Andy Andrews reported that the committee has had good results working with the prosecutors office concerning trespassers. He indicated that there are 3 legal actions being taken at this time and 2 more in progress. He told those in attendance that he is not the person to call if criminal activity is observed. Call the police in these situations. Andrews asked the neighborhood watch drivers to call the police rather than just documenting on the log, if you suspect criminal activity is occurring or about to occur. Reasonable doubt is enough to involve the police. It is OK to call 911 if the nonemergency number is not available. The same dispatcher answers both numbers. The committee is working on developing 2 data bases 1) will be for At-Risk-Homes, the other 2) will be for crimes committed in Leilani Estates. The committee is working with a company that has developed a camera for identifying license plate numbers. More information on this will be presented at a later date.

New Driver Recruitment/Training: Richard Skidmore reported 2 new drivers were trained this month.

Block Captains Update: Mark Hauanio reported that he would be in contact with block captains in the next 2 weeks to discuss working with the At-Risk-Homes database.

Albizia BIIS Project: Mark Hauanio reported that a training day will be setup for residents when BIISC gives them the dates.

Loose Dog Report: Richard Skidmore reported that there were 3 loose dogs reported and photographed this month. 0 were first warnings, 3 were 2nd warnings and 0 were 3rd warnings. He is continuing to work with the Humane Society to get better enforcement. Neighborhood and county leash laws were discussed.

Nominating Committee: The Nomination Committee reported that Greg Armstrong, Ross Stadyk, John Henry, and James Tucker have agreed to run for positions on the Leilani Estates Neighborhood Watch Board of Directors.

Old Business:

A treasury audit needs to be done for the last 2 years. Greg Armstrong asked for volunteers to conduct the audit. Jim Penny and Cheryl Kaupp volunteered for the task.

New Business:

A gas card raffle for volunteer drivers and bikers was conducted by Greg Armstrong. James Tucker won the raffle.

A question was brought up about what can be done about abandoned cars on private property. Two possible solutions are:

- 1) Notify the Home Owners Association, this is a violation of the CC&R's for Leilani Estates.
- 2) Notify the police department, depending on the circumstances, it may be a zoning violation.

If you see suspicious vehicles while doing neighborhood watch route be sure and document the license plate numbers on the log. If something needs to be done right away be sure and call it in to the police.
