Committee Reports:

Squatter/Trespasser Committee: No committee members were in attendance. The group discussed several problem houses to continue to watch as part of our service. The problem house on Maile St. continues to be a problem. A house on Kuponu has drawn some attention but it is not known if it is trespassers or new owners. Home owners Association records will need to be accessed to make this determination. Jim Penny recommended that we follow up with Council Person Ashley Kirkowitz concerning bills introduced to assist with the squatter/trespasser problems.

Curtis Brown, known offender, is back in Leilani Estates and needs to be watched. A white Dodge SUV with a broken windshield and rear window is a known offender and needs to be watched. Another suspicious vehicle is a white Honda SUV with plate HFS359 was seen sitting on Pomaikai in the dark for some unknown reason. A group of small motorcycles have been seen in the area. They are thought to be thieves looking for houses to rob.

The alarms have gone off twice at the LE Community Center. Police have responded but no problems have been found. Could be false alarms or someone could be setting them off prowling around the buildings.

Richard Skidmore discussed the Memorial Celebration for Dona DeBates that will be on Oct. 6th at noon. Donna left her Nissan Frontier pickup to LE Neighborhood Watch. It will be at the celebration and will be auctioned off at a later date.

James Tucker requested that the LE Neighborhood Watch purchase additional wristbands for the Jr. Leader/Pahoa Allstars program. The cost would be about 280.00. After a short discussion, Jim Penny moved to allow James Tucker to make the purchase and Mark Hauanio seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.
