These trees are highly invasive and need to be controlled. BIISC reported that they will no longer be spending their funds on control of Miconia trees.

Loose Dog Report: Richard Skidmore reported that there were 10 loose dogs reported and photographed this month. 1 was a first warnings, 0 2nd warnings and 1 was a 3rd warnings. There were 3 complaints this month related to dogs. 1 was referred to the Humane Society.

Puna Watch Meeting Update: Greg Armstrong reported that most of his report was covered by Officer Cardines. The Humane Society reported that they were reorganizing personnel to better serve the public and that Ramond Corraera is the new pig trapper for our area.

Old Business:
