The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Greg Armstrong.

Police Officers were not available to give the crime statistics report for the month so Greg Armstrong gave the report as follows:

Greg also reported that the Hawaii County Police Department was planning to hire 47 additional officers. Andy Andrews commented that when calling the police for an incident always request a call back for a report on actions taken.

The September 24, 2019 Neighborhood Watch Meeting Minutes were provided as handouts and reviewed by those attending. Mark Hauanio moved to accept the minutes. Motion was seconded by Richard Skidmore. All attending were in favor. Motion carried.

Ross Stadnyk gave the Treasurers Report, indicating a balance of \$9599.62 as of October 28, 2019. Gloria Turkovsky made the motion to approve the Treasurers Report, Jerry Strand seconded the motion and all attending were in favor. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Tresspass/Squatter Committee: Alice Lindahl reported the Maile St. issue continues to be our worst problem. Violations are spreading to neighbors to the north and south. A new situation was reported on Pomaikai St. of noise late at night. This will be considered a CC&R violation. It was reported that a tour company is using unoccupied homes along Kupono St. ,also a CC&R violation. Andy Andrews discussed the Board of Directors position on CC&R violations. They are currently working with our attorneys to put teeth into the fines associated with the violations. Andy also reported on a \$15,000 grant presented to Leilani Estates to be used for safety and security. Thanks to PGV who provided a substantial portion of the money for this grant. Plans are being made on how to best spend this money. Leilani Estates Neighborhood Watch will benefit from this.

New Driver Recruitment/Training: Richard Skidmore reported that one new volunteer has been trained.

Block Captains Update:

Loose Dog Report: Richard Skidmore reported that there were 5 loose dogs reported and photographed this month. 3 were first warnings. One dog was referred to the Humane Society who will likely send out an officer to write a citation or take the dog away.

Old Business: Treasury audit is still pending due to difficulty in locating all the records needed after the chaos of the eruption.

New Business: A membership audit was conducted by Greg Armstrong. Twenty out of 60 volunteers have responded to an email requesting current participation status. Many people are no longer participating and those time slots need to be filled.

Now that we have some money to spend on Neighborhood Watch, Greg asked for suggestion on what equipment needs to be purchased.

Jerry Strand won the gas card raffle and graciously donated it back to Neighborhood Watch.

Greg Nicely won the second drawing.

Greg Armstrong discussed the use of Letters of Authorization that can be given to Neighborhood Watch or the Home Owners Association giving them the authority to act on the owners behalf in the case trespassers and squatters.
