CENTER PROJECT UPDATE ~ FROM THE PRESIDENT

Keeping you updated on the Center Project:

In the January newsletter, I wrote we were meeting with WDS Construction to explore less costly options for our facility renovation, **Plans B & C.** We were able to accomplish this with the help of Javier Garcia from the Center and Steve DeYoung from WDS Construction.

- **♦Plan B** would simply omit the exterior work from the original quote and drop the cost to approximately \$530,000.
- ♦Plan C would omit the exterior work and also modify the interior design to utilize some existing walls and incorporate a less costly reconfiguration of the bathroom facilities, resulting in an approximate cost of \$430,000.

I asked for time on the agenda for the end of February meeting of the Grant Committee to present our new options. Unfortunately, their agenda was full, requiring that we would need to wait until the next meeting. Subsequently, I learned the February meeting needed to be cancelled as many of their members were unable to attend, perhaps enjoying warmer weather in other parts of the country! The next Grant Committee meeting is scheduled for the end of April; I have asked to be included on the agenda.

May God bless you and keep you and make His face shine upon you.


