

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

There are important emergency response resources that Validus Energy makes readily available to all workers for use in responding to an emergency event. Having knowledge of these emergency response resources and understanding response objectives will help you perform with a high level of efficiency if a real emergency occurs.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE GUIDE (ERG)

FIRST RESPONDER

The first worker to recognize the emergency is the First Responder (FR) (see ERG pg. 8). The First Responder is responsible for maintaining the safety of themselves and those nearby, initiating emergency response actions, and implementing the Incident Response Plan (ERG pg. 38-47). The FR is also the initial Incident Commander (IC) until the role is assumed by a higher authority.

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION

The **Emergency Contact Number** that you generally see at all our facility and wellsite entrance signs is made available for the public to report observed emergencies. The **Crew App** is made available to connect our entire workforce on a private emergency communication channel that connect all levels of the company from the field to the corporate leadership team. The Crew App is our designated Emergency Communication platform.

(ERG) INCIDENT POSITION ASSIGNMENTS

The Incident Commander (IC) and/or the Emergency Manager (EM) will assign roles to workers as appropriate to respond to the emergency. These roles will also scale the response depending on the emergency level. It may not be necessary to assign all roles. . *Note: see the Emergency Response Guide for more information.*
