

I want to vote!

What do I need to register to vote?

- **D** – for **DOMICILE** – proof of residence where you will vote
 - Driver's license, non-driver's ID, rental lease, utility bill in your name/address
- **I** – for **IDENTITY** - proof that you are who you say you are
 - Driver's license, non-driver's ID, current passport, military or school ID
- **C** – for **CITIZENSHIP** - proof that you are a US citizen
 - Certificate of citizenship/naturalization, current passport, birth certificate
- **A** – for **AGE** - proof that you will be 18 by election day
 - Driver's license, non-driver's ID, passport, birth certificate

When and where can I register to vote?

- Monday-Friday, 8:00AM—5:00PM at City Hall, One City Hall Plaza on Elm St.
- On Election Day at your Polling Place

What if I don't have these papers with me when I go to register?

- You can sign an affidavit promising that you truly meet these requirements
- After you vote, city officials may check what you wrote on the form

Where is my Polling Place? Where do I vote?

- On the Internet go to the city's website www.manchesternh.gov/elections
- Click on Where Do I Vote? Enter your address

What if I can't go to my Polling Place on Election Day?

- Go to City Hall to register and to vote by Absentee Ballot (do this early!)
- If you are already registered to vote, you can print an application for an absentee ballot at www.manchesternh.gov (click City Clerk, then Elections)
