The Coats for Kids program has been helping to keep children warm since 2009. While the winter weather here in Florida is much better than in other parts of the country, temperatures do get low enough that children need a light to medium weight jacket so they can attend school, participate in after-school programs, and play outdoors.

This year, Council 8086 is taking a supplemental approach to our annual Coat Drive.

- Instead of purchasing *all* of the coats, our Council will be collecting new or slightly worn coats, jackets and hoodies. This is a great opportunity for families with kids or grandkids to pass on their gently worn coats to less fortunate children in our community.
- A Coat Collection Box is set up in the Parish Center through Oct 20. Cash donations are also being accepted to purchase additional coats. Donations can be dropped off at the Parrish Office.
- To accurately determine which schools need coats, Council 8086 is contacting the schools to assure we are reaching those most in need. The feedback we received from the schools is students, especially high school students, prefer hoodies. So our Council will supplement what is collected by purchasing warm hoodies for local students, as needed.

KNIGHT OF THE MONTH: SK Dave Vaden


