Dear Brother Knights,

Recently, the daily Mass Gospel told of the mother of James and John who wanted her sons to be on thrones in the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus asked His disciples if they could be baptized in the same bath He would endure. They said, they could. We know those disciples ran away on Good Friday and were fearful of facing the cross that Jesus freely embraced. Yet, they were told in time they too would drink from the same chalice that Jesus drank. They would indeed suffer and die for Christ.



Jesus didn't come to this earth to establish another earthly kingdom. That would have been easy. Instead, Jesus came to show us that it is only by submitting our will to the Father that we find true freedom and peace. Jesus shows us that obedience and trust is the only way to have real joy.

The mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is that we have a God who has not abandoned us, especially in our most vulnerable moments. He also came to show us how to be human. We human beings, since the Fall of Adam and Eve, have thought that we can be the creator instead of being the creature. Jesus is highly exalted because he showed us who God is and showed us who we can be.

The cross reminds us that God doesn't prevent bad things from happening to good people, but He sees us through it. In addition, the cross was the source of our redemption. The crosses that we bear in this life can be redemptive too. We can offer up the suffering, persecution, misunderstandings, and the like to the Lord for our sins and the sins of the world.

I know being a Catholic is difficult. Some have said that we have the hardest religion. It is hard because when we take the Gospel message seriously we know where it leads...to the cross. James and John thought they had it made. We know they didn't have a clue what Jesus meant. Are we that different? We usually want to run as far away from pain and suffering as quickly as possible. Yet, in this life suffering is inevitable. Jesus' message can appear to be hard, but in reality it is the only real way to live, to lay down our lives for others.

Hopefully, this Lent you are growing closer to the Lord and that as you lay your life down for others you become what Christ created you to be. May the Easter season increase the grace and blessing of Christ for you and your family. Peace,
