

<u>VETERANS REMEMBRANCE AND DEDICATION</u> SERVICE

The rain stopped...the sky partially cleared...the sun appeared! THANK YOU, God! Forty-one persons attended the service, which included twelve Veterans who were recognized.

Posted on the Veterans board is a list of the 117 known Veterans laid to rest in Colemanville U.M. cemetery. The earliest known war a Veteran served in was the War of 1812. Ten known Veterans served in the Civil War. One Veteran served in the Spanish-American War. Twelve served in WWI. Sixty served in WWII. Four Veterans served in both WWII and Korea. Eight served in Korea. Sixteen served in Vietnam. There are five Veterans that it could not be determined during which war they served. The rows of gravestones are numbered at the end of each row. Odd-numbered rows are marked beside the end stone nearest the cemetery driveway. Even-numbered rows are marked beside the end stone nearest the township road. Row one is a single gravestone to the left of the steps leading into the cemetery along the cemetery wall.

For those interested, at the church, there is a three-ring binder available to look through containing a photo of each Veteran's gravestone and obituary.
