

It is absolutely amazing what our community can accomplish when we come together to work and pray! Check it out....

Final totals for the event are as follows: Our goal was to pack 400,000 meals.... we packed 412,128 meals!

This will feed 1,129 children a nutritious meal a day for an entire year! Praise God!

Our goal was to have 2,000 volunteers.....we had **1,678** volunteers!

Our goal was to raise \$118,000 to cover the cost of the meals.... we raised \$123,848.11, which was enough to cover the cost of the meals we packed and also allowed us to put \$3,593.11 toward next year's event! Praise God again!

The final destination for our meals was as follows: 1,260 boxes (272,160 meals) to Malawi via our mission partner, Reach Now International. https://reachnow.net/

93 boxes (20,088 meals) to the Dominican Republic via our mission partner Cross Catholic

555 boxes (119,880 meals) to Peru via our mission partner, World Help. https://worldhelp.net/

the Lancaster Co. Food Hub. As a community, we were able to donate 278 lbs. of food to be used by local community members.
