A Meditation on Grace

What if we choose grace—the sheer, immense, and free grace of the one we call Christ—and let our whole selves fall into it? We will discover then that grace has the power to transform our hearts and minds from dualistic and either/or way of thinking into non-dual and both/and consciousness. In his love-centered life, Jesus clearly shows us that having a strong concept of grace makes a person more open-hearted, empathetic, and accepting of those who are marginalized, rejected, and powerless. The weaker our concept of grace, the more we will become egoistic, self-centered, and selfrighteous, the greater we will discriminate against persons who are different from us, and the stronger we will condone the annihilation of those whom we regard as unworthy. But when our hearts are consumed with grace, we are able to appreciate life as a whole---in all its intricate beauty and messiness, in all its multifaceted diversity and difference. By grace, we are able to see Christ in every human being, in every creature, and in all of creation. It's only by grace that we are able to regard our neighbors, the so-called "least of these"--and even our enemies---as our "other self".

Sadly, not many persons would persistently choose grace. This is so because falling into the grace of Christ is never easy. It is an arduous journey to the cross and self-denial. Risks, ambiguities, fear, pain, disintegration, persecution, suffering, self-sacrifice, and letting go are part of the sanctifying process of grace. The experience of radical grace always begins and continues with the way downward----which is the way of Christ. Our descent into the depths of Christ's grace moves us to pull back from self-centeredness and selfrighteousness, as American philosopher-theologian Philip Clayton asserts: "One thing could save us, though. It's a matter of the heart first, not the mind. The heart of the gospel is love. And grace. Something that God did before we could do anything. No theologian saw and spoke this truth more strongly than John Wesley...Centering on love and grace allows us to pull back from the sense of absolute certainty and hence, universal normativity that separates the disputing parties. If the shared experience of grace forms the bird's body, then the right and left wings can again work together, symmetrically, to propel the bird forward. Personal piety and social holiness become complementary parts of sanctification, for both individuals and groups."

Grace is God freely and wholly giving away Godself to us. It was fully revealed to us in the life, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. When we live in God's grace, we will find ourselves going through the daily process of dying and rising, of death and resurrection. That is how we know, receive, and practice grace.


