New Year Message from the Pastor

Can we dare to dream again? Can we dream together again the “Dream” that has shaped our embodied faith and emancipatory awareness? Collective dreaming of a just, compassionate, inclusive, healing, and peaceful world is a sacred exercise in imagining our life shaped by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the context of our historical consciousness, Martin Luther King, Jr.’s transformative “I Have A Dream” speech on August 28, 1963 was born out not solely of the great Civil Rights leader’s personal dream, but of the communal vision of a creatively just, colorful, and egalitarian society. The “Dream” was drawn from the deep well of the oppressed people’s strong faith in Jesus who dwelt among us “to proclaim the message of love and wholeness to the brokenhearted, to feed the hungry, to set the war prisoners free, to heal and restore the unwell, to redeem and liberate the oppressed, and to bring about economic justice in all peoples’ (Luke 4:18-19 expanded and paraphrased).

Perhaps one of the best life-affirming spiritual disciplines that we can do as we renew our faith this New Year is to mutually cultivate a culture of sharing dreams together for our holistic well-being, the growth of our church,

and the flourishing of communities. The God who dreams persuades us to keep dreaming the “Dream” made possible by Christ’s redeeming and recreating love for us. When we receive God’s gift of dreaming, we let the “Dream” happen in our daily waking hours. As theologian Barbara A. Holmes reminds us, “Through dreams, we envision worlds that have not come yet into being, we find entrances and exits in the maze that is life, and we practice our potential until we are ready to grasp fully” (Holmes, 2012).

May 2026 bring us closer to the Giver of dreams and our dreams for a better world.
