My 11-year-old so Linus is quite the soccer player, while my soon to be 15-year-old daughter is the singer and actor in the family.

I have many attributes that I believe would serve the board well, but many of these attributes are likely similar to many of the other skills other wonderful candidates possess.

What I hope enhances my candidacy is my vision for the future. Please indulge me for a moment or two so that I can set the stage here (how theatrical of me!)

My first introduction to local theater is from the Racine Theater Guild. They're a wonderful organization, run by wonderful people. They have fabulous instructors who run a magnificent summer program for the kids of Racine.

My daughter Delaney was involved with these summer shows for several years. I say 'was' instead of 'is' because this is the first year where she feels she has outgrown the summer program in Racine. I can't say that I blame her, because neither she nor any of her friends, all of whom are deeply in love with the theater, have any interest in their children's theater shows anymore. I love RTG, but she is right that there isn't a place for her generation there right now.

I, too, believe there is a lack of performing opportunities for kids between the ages of 13 to 19 in the summer. Kenosha, Racine, and Union Grove have so many talented kids, and I believe there are not enough opportunities for them to express their talent and passion.

If chosen to serve, my focus will be to attract as many teenagers as possible to Lakeside Players. I believe Lakeside Players is the perfect (a word I do not use lightly) environment for teenage performers to flourish.

I have spoken with several kids up here. None of them knew that wonderful shows such as She Kills Monsters and Heathers were going to be in Kenosha this season, but all of them were enthusiastic once they were made aware.

I want to accomplish two tasks if chosen to join the board. First, I want to create a committee of high school and college aged kids who can help keep us in touch with trends and interests of their generation. I firmly believe that Lakeside Players is the best in southeast Wisconsin for this, but there is always room for growth. Complacency can creep in when one's guard is down.

Many of you know one of my day jobs has been as a pastor (LGBTQ+ affirming, White "Christian" Nationalism condemning - in 2025 I feel the need to add that anytime I self identify or am outed as a pastor) and as a Pastor I have 25 years of experience leading and/or serving on church boards and consulting with other pastors who are navigating challenges with their own church governance. Here are just a few skills I have developed over the years:

- Making difficult financial decisions and coming up with creative fundraisers
- Making policy decisions that are necessary even when they are not popular
- Figuring out who the stakeholders are in any given decision and giving them a voice
- Striving to find consensus where none seems possible
- Recognizing when more time is needed vs when a decision simply has to be made
- Discerning the difference between complicated personalities vs. infighting among board
- Being polite but firm with members who want the board to do their bidding
- Being as transparent as possible but also trustworthy with confidential information
- Balancing the needs and wisdom of both "old guard" and "new voices"
- Working through turf wars between rival subgroups over power and resources
- Finding new ways to communicate with a largely uninterested wider membership
- Setting short term and long term goals & creating the structures need to implement them

Ideas for the future
