COVID-19 Guidelines & Mandatory Requirements for Participants

For this show, we will be observing the following practices and expect competitors to comply with all signage and published information. Updates and additions to this list may be published at any time and will be distributed electronically to all competitors. It is your responsibility to disseminate the information to everyone in your group.

Access:

- 1) Participants must enter Lamplight Equestrian Center show grounds via the Barn Entrance off of Dunham Road. Officials and show staff may enter via the house entrance. Participants are required to stop and have their temperature taken each day. A wrist band will be given to those with temperatures under 99.5°. A new wrist band will be given out each day. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° or higher will not be able to enter the show grounds.
- 2) A participant is a rider, owner, trainer, coach or groom. These are the only individuals permitted on the show grounds. A minor is allowed one (1) parent to accompany them.
- 3) Every person on the show grounds must sign a <u>USEF Waiver and Release of Liability</u> before entering the show grounds.
- 4) Participants are required to wear a face mask/face covering at all times while on the show grounds. A face mask/face covering is not required when riding a horse. Proper wearing of a face mask/face covering is to cover your nose and mouth. Face Shields without a face mask/face covering are not in compliance with the USEF Covid-19 protocols. Participants may choose to wear a face mask/face covering when mounted on a horse, and cannot be penalized for doing so while competing.
- 5) Any person with known or suspected symptoms of COVID-19 or who has been exposed to a person with symptoms of COVIC-19 (cough, shortness of breath, and/or fever) should follow self-quarantine protocol or be barred from or removed from the show grounds. All individuals should monitor their temperature daily, and should not enter the premises if presenting a temperature of 99.5° or higher. The Covid Response plan, for this horse show, will be posted at the show office and followed in case of any individual presenting with a fever or any other symptom(s) of COVID-19.

Spectators:

- 1) Spectators are not permitted on the show grounds at any time.
- Once competition rides are completed for the day, the rider, and everyone associated with the rider, must vacate the show grounds.

Social Distancing/Participant Protocols:

- 1) Participants must comply with social distancing requirements, at all times while on the show grounds.
- 2) A minimum of six (6) feet between individuals must be followed, at all times. All individuals, including competition staff, officials, participants and support personnel must wear a face mask/face covering, at all times when on the competition grounds except for when mounted on a horse (per USEF Update to the Safe Return to Competition Protocol). There are no exceptions when an individual is unmounted.

Hand Washing:

1) Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day. Hand Washing stations and hand sanitizer will be available throughout the show grounds.

Eating or Drinking during the competition:

In order to eat or drink, an individual must move far enough away from others to minimize the
possibility of being within six (6) feet of any other individual before lowering the face mask/face
covering to eat or drink. The face mask/face covering must be immediately replaced over the
nose and mouth when finished.

Stabling Area:

- 1) Avoid entering aisles/stabling areas of other trainer groups. Stabling assignments will be available prior to the show and emailed to all competitors.
- 2) Hand washing and hand sanitization should be done prior to entering the stabling area.
- Individuals should touch only the equipment and supplies necessary for completing tasks of caring for their own horse. Do not share equipment between individuals (helmets, grooming supplies, tack, etc.).
- 4) Keep water buckets and feed buckets/tubs in a fixed position within the stall to ensure feed or water can be provided without touching or removing these items.

Warm-up Areas:

- Warm-up areas will be monitored, if crowding becomes an issue priority, given to order of go.
 On show days, do not expect to enter any warm-up arena more than one hour prior to your
 designated time.
- 2) Any equipment/attire/grooming/training items left unattended in any "common" area within the showgrounds will be removed.

Eating or Drinking during the competition:

2) In order to eat or drink, an individual must move far enough away from others to minimize the possibility of being within six (6) feet of any other individual before lowering the face mask/face covering to eat or drink. The face mask/face covering must be immediately replaced over the nose and mouth when finished.

Golf Carts:

- 1) Face masks/face coverings must be worn by the driver and passengers at all times
- Individuals are allowed to be seated together while being transported by golf cart but capacity
 may not exceed the number of seats on the care or vehicle and all individuals must wear face
 masks/face covering. Congregating on or around a parked or stationary golf care of vehicle is
 prohibited.

Facility - Sanitation and Bio-Security:

- 1) Individuals must stay six (6) feet apart and must not congregate in groups.
- 2) No more than (10) people will be allowed in any single area, such as concession area, entrance to arenas or within each assigned stabling section.
- 3) Hand sanitizing stations will be available throughout the premises.
- 4) Restrooms portable and/or permanent will be cleaned and sanitized throughout the day. All touchpoints and common areas will be cleaned and sanitized.

RV/Campground:

 The camping area will be open. Every effort will be made to park campers using every other space, or a similar method to provide ample room between groups. All requirements, as listed above regarding social distancing, wearing of masks, and temperature monitoring must be followed in the camping area.

Show Office:

 Access to the show office will be limited. Contact with the show secretary will be via text, email or phone. If a problem is deemed to be too complicated, entrance to the show office will be allowed.

Tests:

- There will be no paper tests. Electronic scoring will be utilized. Individual tests will be delivered electronically (via email) to each rider. If not received, please contact the show office to determine if your email is listed correctly.
- In addition, an electronic scoreboard will be available. Class results will be posted on www.foxvillage.com. Class results will also be posted outside of the show office.

Awards:

1) Awards will be on a table located outside the show office. Competitors are required to observe social distancing when picking up ribbons and awards, and are to touch only their own item(s).

Stabling:	Permanent box stalls with doors are 10' x 10' and are available on a first come, first serve basis by entries received by date. All horses must have a stall. Stabling requests honored when possible. Stall bedding is not included, and should be included on your entry form or order from show office by 3:00 PM each day. No guarantees of same day delivery if ordered after 3:00 PM.
	Competitors are required to order a minimum of (2) bags of shavings per stall. Competitors not ordering (2) bags of shavings will be charged a \$25 disposal fee per horse stall.
	Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.
	Stall changes must be approved by show office. Horses found in an incorrect stall may be moved and fined \$50.00. This is for safety issues. Stallion owners need to bring suitable equipment to close off the stall if necessary, for the safety of your horse and those stabled near him.
	Stalls will be available after 12 PM on FRIDAY. Early arrivals and late departures must be approved my show management, and may be assessed additional stabling fees. SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN STALL AREAS.
Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:	Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies. See GR. 311.
	During inclement weather, for safety and social distancing, participants will be asked to shelter in their personal vehicles or in their tack stall. Participants will not be allowed to congregate in the concession stand or the show office.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND MINORS USEF Rule GR901.29/GR1301.7/GR1301.8: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

WARNING: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities. Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership will result in competitor being charged non-member fees. Members that are unable to produce the USDF memberships cards/registrations or a facsimile will be asked to sign an affidavit and pay an affidavit fee. All entries are taken on a first come, first served basis. Some shows return late arriving entries after the show is filled, and some shows place entries on a wait list on an as-received basis. Please check each show for any additional policies. Send in the entries as soon as possible to assure entry to the show. Only one horse-rider combination, per entry form, per show.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top three riders

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.

<u>or</u>

b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

2021 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2021 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

 Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

USEF Equine Vaccination Rule

From the USEF Communications Department

Lexington, Ky. - In January, the USEF Board of Directors approved an addition to the rule book, which outlines equine vaccination requirements at licensed competitions. Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

Due to several high profile Equine Herpes (EHV) outbreaks in recent years that have involved the neuropathic strain of the virus (equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy-EHM), some competitions have placed vaccination requirements on their competitors that go beyond most accepted medical opinions and raise concern that unnecessary requirements can potentially put a horse at risk. The intent of this rule is to ensure that all licensed competitions comply with the vaccination guidelines for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes (Rhinopneumonitis) published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP). These guidelines are reviewed by infectious disease experts regularly, and recommend vaccinating competition horses at six-month intervals for both equine influenza (flu) and rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1 and EHV-4). There is not a vaccine that protects against EHM.

Intended to promote proper vaccination protocols, this rule does not anticipate an increased workload for competition management. The flu vaccination information can be added to the documentation already required by most competitions: a horse's health certificate and a negative coggins test.
