

# Caister-on-Sea Access Audit



This route forms part of the National Trail

This is a fully accessible route with wonderful beach views and access

This step and obstruction free walk with toilets, car parking and seating available throughout this route should suit everyone.

The Caister on Sea route is linear and is fully accessible throughout.

It can be made into a circular route depending upon ability

Two options available for all users.

**Car parking and access**

Car park is located off Second Avenue, Caister-on-Sea

Limited car parking for the route

Off street parking on dedicated car park

Aggregate surface - flat and level throughout

**Post code for the car park on second avenue is NR30 5PG**



**On site toilets**

Toilet block on site as part of the car park with dedicated disabled facility as part of the complex.

Access to the sea front walk is via a surfaced ramp. This has a slope of less than three degrees.

There is a gap left by the vehicle barrier of 1.2 metres



**Sea front path**

The sea front path has a full tarmac surface throughout and is flat, even and stable throughout

The cross fall is minimal and there is very little change in the access depending on the season.

The path is in excess of 3 metres throughout



Great views throughout the route

Route can be expanded depending upon ability by using the beach to create a circular route



Ideal at any time of the year



**Sea front path details**

From the car park retrace your steps to the entrance past the toilets and then turn left towards the sea

The slope will take you to the seafront path and these spectacular views



Access to the beach is via a concrete slope at the southern end of the path

This is not fully accessible but has a handrail to assist with the slope

Access from here is on the sandy beach



**Norfolk Coast Path**

The norfolk coast path is a National Trail and runs around the whole of the Norfolk Coastline.

This section is one of the most accessible parts of the route which allows wonderful views across the beach at Caister.

More sections of the National Trail have been audited to make sure that more people can enjoy the pleasure of the Norfolk coastline.



**National Trail Route**

The National Trail runs through the car park and exits at the North end of the car park.

There are bollards preventing vehicle use of the path and there is a 1.2 metre gap between the bollards

The path is over 2.5 metres wide and is flat and surfaced throughout. There are benches throughout the route





## What can I expect on this walk?



Easy access and obstruction free throughout the whole route

Free car parking at Second Avenue car park.

Seating available throughout the walk. The seating is available to over look the Caister beach and out to sea. This route offers easy access to the beach throughout the year.

*What can I expect to see?*

Gulls, boats on the sea, wind turbines. You may see seals either on the beach or just off shore

*What can I hear?*

Crashing of the sea on the shore, sea breeze blowing through the dunes, people walking through the area

*What facilities are there?*

Toilets available on site

Car parking

Full range of local facilities can be accessed in Caister or in Great Yarmouth

## How can I get there?

By bus: Caister is well served by bus services by a number of operators.

Use the travel line website for further details

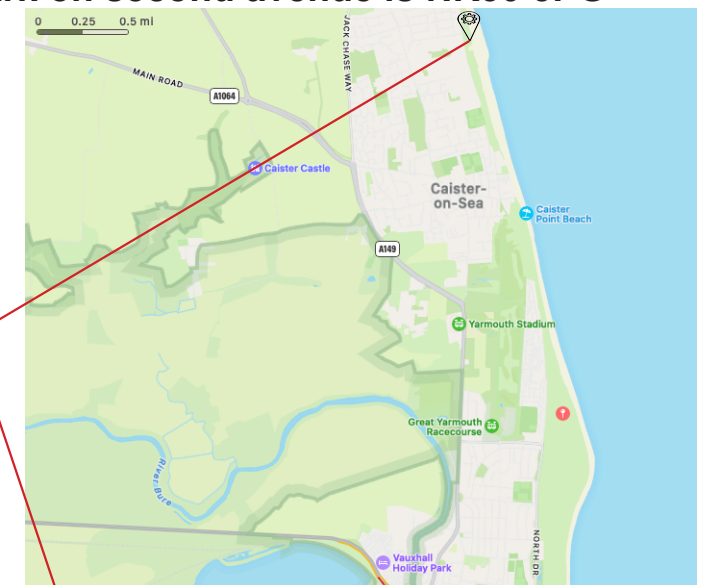
Norwich to Caister is 45 minutes via the A47 and A1064

Cromer to Caister is 50 minutes via the A149

Yarmouth to Caister is 10 minutes via the A149
