First gathered in 1636 as a branch of First Church in Boston, this congregation was established as an independent church in 1639. This magnificent building was designed by Alexander Parris; it is the fourth meeting house of the Church and was completed in 1828. John Adams and John Quincy Adams, the second and sixth Presidents of the United States, were life-long members of the Church and are entombed along with their wives Abigail Adams and Louisa Catherine Adams in the Church's crypt.
