The book this month is *Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents* by Isabel Wilkerson. In this brilliant and much acclaimed book, Isabel Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America as she explores, through an immersive, deeply researched narrative and stories about real people, how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings. Beautifully written, original, and revealing, it is an eye-opening story of people and history, and a reexamination of what lies under the surface of ordinary lives and of American life today.
