At Inspire Equine Assisted Center, located in Clearwater Florida, you could watch as a beautiful 13.2 hand, 7 year old Gypsy Vanner gelding named Buccaneer partners with his rider through a difficult obstacle course. Buccaneer joined the Inspire herd in 2017 at the age of 3 years old after being won by Inspire during the Lexlin Gypsy Gift Program.

Over 80 PATH International member centers participated in the contest to be able to receive one of the 10 Gypsy Vanners that were to be donated through the program. Inspire Equine Assisted Center, with the help of the Tampa Bay community, finished in third place and picked Lexlin's Western Lineage as their new member of their herd. Inspire named him Buccaneer in honor of the local NFL football team, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

With his amazing mustache, which is a breed trait, and his funny and loving personality, Buccaneer has become a valuable member of the Inspire program. Buccaneer is part of the adaptive riding program for teens and adults with disabilities. Because of his height, Buccaneer is easy for side walkers to assist a rider if they need special support when on the horse.

The Gypsy Vanner breed is very strong and Buccaneer can accommodate most adult riders. Overall, Buccaneer brings so much joy to all of the Inspire participants, especially when he flashes his amazing mustache!
