


The good news is they were finally allowed to return home on Tuesday the 25th and hopefully for

Greetings from your Inspector.

September is upon us and there is no indication that Grand Lodge will lift the "lockdown" on Lodge meetings and assemblies at any time before the New Year. One major affect here is there will be no election of Officers this year. Current officers will continue to serve in their present Offices as we move into 2021. Should

someone have to drop out, the vacancy will be covered by the Worshipful Master's authority to appoint. When the lockdown is lifted, one of the first orders of business will be an Election of Officers, under an Inspector's dispensation for a Special Election. Current Officers should discuss this situation and verify the status of current officers for the remainder of 2020 and availability for 2021. Officers are reminded that demonstrated proficiency is a requirement for advancement and study and preparation should continue.

Grand Lodge has directed that lodges be closed and not used for Masonic assemblies. This does not prohibit individuals meeting privately away from the Lodge for coaching or mentoring and social activities. CDC guidelines for social distancing and safety should be observed. No degree work can be exemplified outside the lodge (social distancing). Coaches and Mentors are urged to continue meeting with candidates and Officers to maintain their proficiency and learning of necessary ritual as well as to keep up their interest in the Fraternity.

Should any member need assistance, remember the Masonic Outreach through Grand Lodge and either contact them directly or ask for help from one of your Officers.

Information is coming regarding a "Virtual" Installation of Grand Lodge Officers in October at the usual time.

Please continue to stay in contact with members of your lodges to ensure their needs, if any, are being met.

Hope to see you in Lodge in the near future.




September Greetings from Job's Daughters Bethel No. 230, Salinas
