

We know that C says /k/.

For example: <u>ca</u>t, <u>cu</u>p and <u>co</u>ne.

If you notice, when C is followed by a,o,u, it makes a hard c sound which is /k/.

When C is followed by e,i,y, it makes a **soft c** sound which is /s/.

For example: <u>ce</u>nt, spi<u>cy</u> and pen<u>ci</u>l.

To recap:

Hard c	/k/	When c is followed by a, o, u
Soft c	/s/	When c is followed by e, i, y
