



We know that **g** says /g/.

For example: gap, gum and got.

If you notice, when g is followed by a, o, u, it makes a **hard g** sound which is /g/.

When g is followed by e, i, y, it makes a **soft g** sound which is /j/.

For example: gem, margin, gym.

To recap:

Hard g	/g/	When g is followed by a, o, u
Soft g	/j/	When g is followed by e, i, y
