

We know that g says /g/.

For example: gap, gum and got.

If you notice, when g is followed by  $\underline{a,o,u}$ , it makes a hard g sound which is /g/.

When g is followed by  $e_i$ , it makes a **soft** g sound which is /j/.

For example: gem, margin, gym.

## To recap:

Hard g	/g/	When g is followed by a, o, u
Soft g	/j/	When g is followed by e, i, y
