Answers

Type of Poem	Rules
Free Verse	No consistent rules
Haiku	5-7-5 syllable per line rule
Limerick	5 lines; Rhyme scheme: A-A-B-B-A: Usually 10 syllables per line (doesn't rhyme)
Rhymed Poetry	Rhymes in some way
Epic	Long; Narrative; About adventures and feats of characters
Narrative	Tells a story
Pastoral	About rural life landscapes and the natural world
Sonnet	14 lines with internal rhymes
Elegy	About death or loss; tribute to someone or something
Ode	Tribute to someone or something; don't have to be dead
Lyric	About emotions and feelings
Ballad	Narrative poem or song; follows a pattern of rhymed quatrains
Villanelle	19 lines; 5 tercets and 1 quatrain; Has a specific internal rhyme scheme; About obsessions or other intense things
Soliloquy	Monologue; Character speaks to themselves allowing the reader to gain knowledge that they otherwise might not know; Not always poems
