

Types of Sentences: Notes

What is a sentence?

- A sentence has **two basic parts**: the **subject** and the **predicate**.
 - The subject is **the person**, **place** or **thing performing the action**, or **what/whom** the sentence is about.
 - The predicate is the **action** in the sentence.
- A sentence **ALWAYS** has punctuation at the end. The punctuation can be the period, the question mark, or the exclamation point.
- The first letter of a sentence is capitalized.

What types of sentences are there?

- 1) <u>Declarative (Statement.) Sentence</u>
 - **Most common** type of sentence
 - Ends with a **period**
 - Statement
 - Tells us something
 - He likes to eat pizza.

2) <u>Interrogative (Question?) Sentence</u>

- Question
- Ends with a question mark
- Asks a question
 - What is your favorite food?

3) Imperative (Command./!) Sentence

- Command
- Ends with a **period** or an **exclamation point**
- Tells us to do something (Perform an action)
 - Clean your room.
 - o Stop!

4) Exclamatory (Exclamation!) Sentence

- Exclamation
- Ends with an **exclamation point**
- Shows excitement or surprise
 - O That was fun!
