Trivia:

- Groundhog Day originated from an ancient European tradition called Candlemas Day, where clergy would bless candles and distribute them to ward off the darkness of winter.
- The first official Groundhog Day celebration took place on February 2, 1887, in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania.
- According to legend, if Punxsutawney Phil sees his shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter. If he doesn't see his shadow, spring will arrive early.
- The first Olympic Games took place in 776BC
- In 393 AD, the Olympic Games were cancelled and didn't start up again for over 1,500 years!
- 1896, when a man named Baron Pierre de Coubertin started a revival of the Games. He called this new event the 'modern Olympics' – and it's still going today!
- In ancient times, a flame burned throughout the Games as a tribute to the goddess, Hestia. Since 1928, this tradition has continued in the modern Games, but instead of an altar, the flame burns in a special torch and it is lit from the sun in Olympia, Greece.
- New torches and medals are designed for each Olympics.
- Shrove Tuesday is a Christian festival celebrated in many countries across the globe. It falls on the Tuesday before the beginning of Lent
- The exact date of Shrove Tuesday changes from year to year. But one thing stays the same — it's always 47 days before Easter Sunday.
- In the United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia and Canada, Shrove Tuesday has another name... Pancake Day!
