


### **Project Overview**

- Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)
  - Long-range transportation planning document for Stanislaus Region
  - Mandated by Federal law
  - Plan to meet the region's transportation goals regarding current and future mobility needs
  - Addresses all transportation modes
  - Guides transportation programming documents and plans
  - Covers a minimum 20-year planning horizon
  - Planning Horizon for 2026 Plan Update is 2049
  - Required to be updated every 4 years



### **Project Overview**

- Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS)
  - Mandated by Senate Bill 375 (SB 375)
  - Demonstrates how greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction targets can be met through integrated land use, housing, and transportation planning
    - Evaluates various land use planning scenarios
  - Identifies strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions:
    - Alternative development patterns
    - Infrastructure
    - Additional transportation measures or policies that result in fewer and/or shorter automobile and light truck trips





# **California Environmental Quality Act Purpose**


- Environmental Impact Report (EIR) aims to inform the public and disclose environmental impacts and does not recommend approval or denial of the project
- The Stanislaus Council of Governments Policy Board will consider the information in the EIR among other factors in making a decision on the 2026 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (RTP/SCS)


# **CEQA Purpose**

- Disclose the significant environmental effects of proposed actions
- Identify ways to avoid or reduce environmental impacts
- Consider feasible alternatives to proposed actions
- Enhance public participation in the planning process

# **Environmental Impact Report (EIR)**

- Programmatic EIR a broad, comprehensive evaluation that covers many actions, longrange plans
- Baseline for modeling and analysis established with data available at the time Notice of Preparation is released
- Many transportation projects are not yet fully designed and will require additional project level environmental analysis/review prior to approval and implementation

# **Projected Schedule**

- April 15, 2025 Release of Notice of Preparation. Initiated a 30-day public review and officially started the California Environmental Quality Act process
- May 15, 2025 Last day to submit comments on Environmental Impact Report scope
- January/February 2026 Release of Draft Environmental Impact Report for public comment; 45-day public review period
- Spring 2026 Public hearings on the Final Environmental Impact Report and Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy
