- 1) Please see the attached pre-proposal meeting agenda/minutes and sign-in sheet from the January 4, 2022, virtual meeting. Meeting minutes include question(s) asked by attendees with Navajo DOT response(s).
  - a. Wilson has contacted the Chapter regarding the use of the NE corner N19/N5000 intersection lot for a potential equipment/storage yard. The Chapter has indicated that this location may be used for the project yard as described. The Contractor will still be responsible for obtaining the Chapter's written approval/permission to use the property.
- 2) The following inquiry was received prior to the January 5, 2022, deadline date.
  - a. For the quality control bid item, will this job require testing compressive strength cylinders for the fence posts? If so, how many every cubic yards does the QC need to take cylinders? Will the QC need to test the slump and air content for every concrete truck load? In the FP-14, section 601.07 refers to 106.02 (visual inspection) and 106.03 (certs).
    - *i.* <u>Response:</u> Yes, QC testing of the concrete footings for the fence posts will need to follow the requirements listed in Table 601-1 of Section 601 of the FP-14 specifications. Since the FP-14 spec does not specify a frequency on the QC testing, please follow the 2019 NMDOT, Section 906 spec frequency noted below.
      - Each mix design per day of placement. Test the first three loads, with one randomly sampled for one set of cylinders. Sample for testing and cylinders, one random load from each subsequent 6 load sublot.
- 3) The attached wage rate decision (NM20210035 06/18/2021) shall be followed for this contract.
- 4) NDOT requires that the Contractor submit with the Proposal an SF-24 Bid Bond per the Clause on the following page.

# Clause NN-228-1 Bid Guarantee:

Submit the bid guarantee on Bid Form SF-24, Bid Bond:

(a) Failure to furnish a bid guarantee in the proper form and amount, by the time set for opening of bids, will be cause for rejection of the bid.

(b) The bidder shall furnish a bid guarantee in the form of a firm commitment, e.g., bid bond supported by good and sufficient surety or sureties acceptable to the Government, postal money order, certified check, cashier's check, irrevocable letter of credit, or, under Treasury Department regulations, certain bonds or notes of the United States. The Government will return bid guarantees, other than bid bonds.

(1) To unsuccessful bidders as soon as practicable after the opening of bids; and

(2) To the successful bidder upon execution of contractual documents and bonds (including any necessary coinsurance or reinsurance agreements), as required by the bid as accepted.

(c) The amount of the bid guarantee shall be <u>ten (10)</u> percent of the bid price per Navajo Nation Procurement Code 12 N.N.C. §341 Bid Security.

(d) If the successful bidder, upon acceptance of its bid by the Government within the period specified for acceptance, fails to execute all contractual documents or furnish executed bond(s) within 10 days after receipt of the forms by the bidder, the Government may terminate the contract for default.

(e) In the event the contract is terminated for default, the bidder is liable for any cost of acquiring the work that exceeds the amount of its bid, and the bid guarantee is available to offset the difference.

(f) If the bid guarantee is other than a corporate or individual surety, sign the SF-24 as the principal and make a statement on the form pledging the security. Make checks or money orders payable to the agency issuing the solicitation.

(g) *Power of attorney*. A corporate surety shall submit a current power of attorney for the signing agent or attorney-in-fact with each bid bond.

(h) *Evidence of guarantee assistance*. A surety that has a guarantee of assistance from the Small Business Administration shall submit a copy of its *"Surety Bond Guarantee Agreement"* with each SF-24 bid bond form. In addition, submit a power of attorney for the surety representative identified in the agreement.

- B. PROPOSAL FORMAT: Appearance of the proposal is important and professionalism in the proposal presentation should not be neglected. The proposal standards are as follows:
  - a. The proposal shall not exceed ten (10) 7 single-sided pages (maximum 8 1/2" x 11"). Submissions exceeding the ten (10) 7-page limit will be considered non-responsive and will be un-rated. All pages include proposal, photos, charts, graphs, exhibits, letter of interest, etc. are counted toward the ten (10) 7 pages.
  - b. Pages that <u>do not</u> count towards the ten (10) 7-page limit are Certificates of Insurance and Navajo Business Certificate.

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

### Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

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### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

For all other purposes, each Surety binds itself, jointly and severally with the Principal, for the payment of the sum shown opposite the name of the Surety. If no limit of liability is indicated, the limit of liability is the full amount of the penal sum.

### CONDITIONS:

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. This form is authorized for use when a bid guaranty is required. Any deviation from this form will require the written approval of the Administrator of General Services.

2. Insert the full legal name and business address of the Principal in the space designated "Principal" on the face of the form. An authorized person shall sign the bond. Any person signing in a representative capacity (e.g., an attorney-in-fact) must furnish evidence of authority if that representative is not a member of the firm, partnership, or joint venture, or an officer of the corporation involved.

3. The bond may express penal sum as a percentage of the bid price. In these cases, the bond may state a maximum dollar limitation (e.g., 20% of the bid price but the amount not to exceed dollars).

4. (a) Corporations executing the bond as sureties must appear on the Department of the Treasury's list of approved sureties and must act within the limitations listed therein. The value put into the LIABILITY LIMIT block is the penal sum (i.e., the face value) of the bond, unless a co-surety arrangement is proposed.
