

# Sweet Land of Liberty

America's Revolutionary War began with the "shots heard around the world" at the Battles of Lexington and Concord 250 years ago, on April 19, 1775. On July 4<sup>th</sup> a year later, the Second Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence. Fifty six delegates signed the historic document, writing their names below the final paragraph: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

For the first time in history, a new nation was forged based on ideas and principles – rather than conquest, royal lineage, or papal authority. The fact that a united group of colonies subject to the tyranny of a king could declare their own sovereignty and become "free and independent states" impacted nations throughout the world. The concepts that "All men are created equal," that "we are endowed by our Creator with certain unalienable rights," and that "We the People" must give our consent to be governed were truly revolutionary ideas.

Common men and women, led by learned men who had studied the works of political theorists like John Locke, and protected by acts of Divine Intervention, challenged the strongest military in the world – and won! Their vision and their fight for freedom changed the world.

This Independence Day, July 4, 2025, marks the beginning of a year-long 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the founding of this blessed nation.

As we once again enjoy the festivities of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, we should take time to re-read the Declaration of Independence, learn a little more about our nation's founding, or watch a movie about America's Revolutionary War. It is also a day to be thankful for the blessings of liberty that were fought for and earned by brave and courageous patriots.






Pictured are attendees of our June book club hosted by Theresa and Dan Eckert. We discussed *Government Gangsters* by Kash Patel.


