





MEMORIAL DAY

REMEMBERING THEIR ULTIMATE SACRIFICE

We owe our freedom to the millions of men and women who served our country in the military, fighting to preserve our nation and protecting us against the evils of tyranny throughout the world. We owe a special debt of gratitude to those who gave the ultimate sacrifice – their lives – to defend freedom.

Memorial Day offers unique opportunities to honor these men and women. Originally called "Decoration Day," this nationwide day of remembrance was officially proclaimed by General John Logan following the Civil War. He stated, "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves" of the more than 620,000 soldiers killed in that war. He observed their "bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land." Now known as "Memorial Day," the day is meant to honor our military personnel who died while serving in the United States armed forces. It is observed the last Monday in May each year.

Wearing a red poppy on Memorial Day is one simple way we remember these heroes. The story of the poppy goes back to World War I, which took a devastating toll on the troops. Lieutenant Colonel John McCrea, a Canadian brigade surgeon who was caring for fallen soldiers in Belgium, was struck by the red poppies blooming on the deadly fields. That scene inspired him to write the now-famous poem, "In Flanders Fields."

In memory of the fallen, American flags should be hung at half-staff until noon on Memorial Day, then raised to their full glory.

After enjoying Memorial Day weekend parades and barbecues with family and friends, we should focus on the real meaning of the holiday. Plan to spend an evening watching some inspirational movies. "Hacksaw Ridge" (2016), "Black Hawk Down" (2001), "Saving Private Ryan" (1998), "Lone Survivor" (2013), "13 Hours: The Secret Soldiers of Benghazi" (2016), and "Glory" (1989) are a few of the best. They will teach us, inspire our families, and honor those who gave "the last full measure of devotion" to our blessed country.
