Men in the Arena

"Citizenship in a Republic"

Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt, one of our great Republican presidents, was a bold and daring leader at a time when the United States was emerging as an important world power. Assuming the presidency in September of 1901 following the assassination of President McKinley, and serving as president until March 1909, this historical legend impacted this country, the Western Hemisphere, and the world with his actions, writings, and oratory.

In April of 1910 while touring Europe, the former president delivered a speech entitled "Citizenship in a Republic" at the Sorbonne in Paris. Roosevelt spoke about the duties each of us bear to successfully preserve our representative form of government. One notable part of that speech has become known as "The Man in the Arena."

"It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes short again and again, because there is no effort without error and shortcoming; but who does actually strive to do the deeds; who knows great enthusiasms, the great devotions; who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who neither know victory nor defeat."

Today, two men are clearly in the arena—marred by dust and sweat and blood. Facing virulent critics, assassination threats, personal defamation, and economic turmoil, President Donald Trump and businessman/DOGE leader Elon Musk are striving valiantly to preserve our republic for future generations.

They lead by example. We can choose to magnify their courageous efforts as citizens of our republic or be timid souls who know neither victory nor defeat. The choice is ours.

On July 4, 2026, we will celebrate the 250th birthday of the United States!



The White House has already teamed up with Hillsdale College and the U.S. Department of Education to produce a series of historical videos in the official "Countdown to America's 250th Anniversary."

The announcement on the White House website reads, "On July 4, 2026, America will celebrate the most important milestone in our country's history—250 years of American Independence. 'With a single sheet of parchment and 56 signatures, America began the greatest political journey in human history,' said President Trump of this momentous anniversary."

The White House announcement includes links to two videos—an introduction to "The Story of America" project and a recounting of the Battles of Lexington and Concord on April 19, 1775, during which the American militiamen faced British regular troops. The "shot heard round the world" was the beginning of the Revolutionary War and our nation's fight for individual liberty and freedom. Click on this link to watch the videos:

An additional video was released honoring the 250th anniversary of Paul Revere's famous ride when he warned the colonists of the approach of the British troops. Two hundred and fifty years later, we remember his courage—and the enduring spirit of liberty that defines our nation."




Books, Food, and Fun


