TABOADELLA

DÃO PORTUGAL



The Amorim family have been involved in wine since 1870, when they first negotiated sales of cork to the Caves do Vinho do Porto, in Vila Nova de Gaia. Today they are one of the most renowned family groups in Portugal with businesses in many countries and many different lines of activity.

Taboadella consists of 40 hectares of vineyards lying between Vale do Pereiro and the Vale do Sequeira, in a high triangular plateau of 400 - 530 m altitude, with gentle slopes towards the Southeast, and a sunny exposition to the south and west. The mountain chains protect the vineyard from the Atlantic weather and the bitter winds from Spain, resulting in a microclimate perfectly located where maritime and continental influences meet. The autumn equinox brings a marked change to the weather, and generally, there are heavy rains and sometimes frost to greet the end of Spring.
