Presidents report

Scott started by saying we are still waiting on estimate from Kogge for running the water line. He said that Kogge can bore the line underground as an option.

Cost of electricity is supposed to take a huge jump in June. Scott said he is looking into having Dynagy supply all of our electric. We have three meters, 2 of which are already on Dynagy. It could save several cents per kilowatt hr.

Log repair is complete. The other repair company sent an email with information on stain from Sherwin Williams they used in past. What we have used previously cost \$78.49 per gal, \$387.00 per 5 gal bucket. Scott thinks the whole building should be done. There are also places that need calked. Suggestion was made to purchase 5 gal and see how far it goes.

Nathan said there is enough caulking, plus a gal or two of stain here.

Dan suggested using on hand stain to stain repairs and let them dry

Ben Brown made motion to purchase 5 gal of stain Bob Meihls seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Scott said Mike Lehman requested new gun racks. Gene Smart said he would try to build some using the material we have on hand.

Wabash will be here Monday to reattach the fiber.

Ben then said he checked into liability for insurance purposes. Our insurance people were not happy about having non-members shooting, so he intends to go back to just members shooting. He will use same rules as Rimfire Benchrest Federation. All money he makes after the cost of maintaining the range will go to the club now.

It was suggested we do more to market the Rimfire Shoots to the club members.

Annette said that so far only 59 raffle tickets have been sold.

She and Scott mailed out paper newsletters to people that requested them or members who don't have email at a cost of about \$100.00

Dan sent the electronic newsletter.

Mark Linn

Mark reported that we had some wind damage. There is a limb still hanging on a maple tree, and trim missing on the high house.

Mark had the tractor serviced, changed fluids and filters at cost of a few hundred dollars.

All people who volunteered to help mow have been notified we can start mowing.

Mark then asked if we have theft insurance. Yes we do. Mark will get the tractor serial number for them.

Chris will check on stocking pond with Talapia to help control the algae in pond, per Nathan's suggestion.
