WHEREAS, to help more people achieve and sustain long-term recovery, 208 Recovery North, along with other local community partners, invites all residents to participate in Recovery Month events and activities that promote awareness, prevention, and treatment; and

WHEREAS, September has been designated as National Recovery Month to promote and support treatment and recovery practices, the strong and proud recovery community, and the dedication of service providers and community members across the nation who make recovery possible.
