





Award-winning documentary filmmaker, Errol Webber has earned a reputation as a refined film producer and cinematographer, adept at capturing polished, hyper real visuals and telling compelling stories.

Webber studied Film at the Maryland Institute College of Art, where, as a freshman, he opened his own photography and video production business. Upon graduating in 2008, Webber shot a documentary film in Africa – *Music By Prudence* - about a band of gifted Zimbabwean musicians with disabilities. *Music By Prudence* won the Academy Award for Best Documentary Short Subject in 2010.

The decade-long, coming-of-age documentary film, *American Promise*, explores the nuances of public vs. private education in New York. *American Promise* won the Special Jury Award for Achievement in Filmmaking at the 2013 Sundance Film Festival.

Webber's talent for film lies not in his ability to bring his world to the viewer, but the urgency with which he immerses the viewer into his world. Webber is best known for his arresting imagery and rebellious compositions. After more than a decade, award-winning Los Angeles Film Producer, Errol Webber continues in his most prized obsession; filmmaking.

OUR MISSION:

To preserve America's rich military history through producing documentary films of veteran stories, and place a much-needed spotlight on veteran mental health.

OUR LONG-TERM GOALS:

- Documentary capture the oral history of America's military Veterans.
- Archive military veteran stories, to be made available for libraries.
- Regularly produce short and feature-length military documentaries.
- Curate military stories for use in the Veteran Legacy Center museum.
- Fully fund and build the Veteran Legacy Center in Orange County, CA.
- Provide a suite of healthcare and career services to military veterans.
- Facilitate multiple office spaces to veteran service organizations.
- Become a host for community events at the Veteran Legacy Center.
- Create supplemental retirement care facilities to service veterans.
- Produce in-house film/tv/radio/podcast content serving veterans.





DOCUMENTARY FILM PRODUCTION:

To date, we have captured the stories of 10 Vietnam military veterans. The footage from these interviews will be used to produce a short documentary in 2023.







DOCUMENTARY FILM PRODUCTION ANNUAL BUDGET:

Over the next 20 years, we'll be capturing thousands more of these military stories, at a rate of roughly 10 per month. The projected budget for annual documentary capture on a minimal-size film crew is \$250,000/year. The cost to produce a short documentary is \$100,000 per film.



VETERAN LEGACY CENTER MUSEUM:

Over the next five years, the goal is to purchase an existing building or build a new building in Orange County, CA that will be the museum and multi-purpose space of the Veteran Legacy Center.



Veteran Museum space showcasing permanent and rotating exhibitions of Military memorabilia, books, photos, and videos.



400-seat stage theater with retractable movie screen for events.



Atrium for hosting Veteran Legacy Center and community events.



VETERAN LEGACY CENTER MUSEUM:

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Film/TV production and podcasting studio, with post-production suite.



Concessions restaurant for serving food and alcoholic beverages.



Office spaces available for rent to veteran-centered services, including Boardroom and Classroom spaces for presentations and classes.

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
VETERAN LEGACY CENTER BUDGET:

- The initial budget for the acquisition of a building, or to begin new construction in Orange County, CA is \$5,000,000, with an additional \$10,000,000 to be spent over the next 20 years.
- Over the first 10 years, the Veteran Legacy Center will be able to mostly sustain itself from the revenue derived from hosting events, renting out event spaces, and office spaces, and selling food and alcoholic beverage concessions.
