Have you checked out who the candidates are for Mayor, Selectman, Town Council and Board of Education in the 2023 Municipal Elections? The League of Women Voters of Greater Hartford (LWVGH) has an online voters' guide to help at our 'one-stop-shop' voter information site Vote411.org.

LWVGH is contacting ballot approved candidates and providing each of them free space in Vote411.org. The candidates are invited to provide a bio, answers to a few questions pertinent to the office, and a photo to be uploaded to the site which can then be easily viewed by you, the voter. Just go to Vote411.org, put in your state and address and you will have access to your town guide and to the candidates who provide their information.

Local town elections are important, where your taxes count the most.

WHY USE VOTE411?

VOTE411 is committed to ensuring that voters have uniform information they need to successfully participate in every election. Every election is important to ensuring that our laws and policies reflect the values and beliefs of our communities and that is particularly true in our local municipal elections. On the Vote411.org home page, the viewer will find three options:

- ▶ **Find What's on Your Ballot** - You will be prompted to enter your home address and this will bring you to your Voter Guide.

Check out all the races for Town Council, Mayor, First Selectman, and Board of Education.
Compare Candidates side by side. Find the Question on your ballot if there is one for your town.
- ▶ **Verify Voter Registration** - Not sure you are registered or where your voting location is? This option takes you directly to the Sec. of State online look-up tool. Choose Connecticut, put in your address, and get confirmation that you are registered, your party or unaffiliated status, your voting location.
- ▶ **Register to Vote** - This option takes you to the online Connecticut voter registration section.

There is a link to Town Ballots to see a sample of the printed ballot you will get on Election Day. Available through the link at the top of the page that shows your race after October 1.

From Vote411.org you can print or email the information you choose to use as a reference when you actually vote. LWV [Vote411](http://Vote411.org) does not save your information; it will be lost when you leave the page. Only candidates that appear on your Election Day ballot will be listed. Additional information may be available for your area so be sure to scroll to the bottom of the page and view other links.
