



2017 Year End Awards



President's Award

is presented by the club President for outstanding contributions to the Arabian breed and for exceptional service to AHA and WDHA club members.


Thank-you Award




Ambassador Award

was created in 1992. It is an annual award made by the club President according to the criteria listed below

- The owner is a voting member of WDHA in good standing
- The nominated horse has been an outstanding Ambassador for the Arabian breed in one or more of the following areas:
 - The horse has demonstrated the versatility of the Arabian or Half/Anglo Arabian in an area that is unique.
 - The horse has an outstanding history in competition
 - The horse has promoted the breed to the general public in areas outside the usual breed/horse show circuit
 - The horse has been an outstanding family horse and family friend.

For the following reasons this horse has been nominated and chosen for the 2017 Ambassador award. He exemplifies what it means to be a true ambassador for the Arabian Breed. He has shown his competitiveness in the open show circuit while taking his owner and rider through many stages of her riding career. He has been a willing and patient companion, participating in many different events from western to sporthorse, This horse is truly a family friend and companion and has promoted the



Arabian breed to the public in many diverse ways. He became famous participating in a TV commercial for the local feed store in Pulaski WI, to his notoriety as Packer Paragon at Horse-A-Rama, as a gentle soul allowing many kids to hand paint on him for the Painting Ponies event, and his picture was also shared with his owner and him in the pond going for a swim. AHA Convention 2017 Denver, Colorado

I had the amazing opportunity to represent WDHA at the 2017 AHA Convention, in Denver, Colorado. After we signed in at convention the next thing on the agenda was to sign the "Certificate of Selected Voting Delegate and Alternates" or credentialing. This is a matter taken very seriously by AHA as it gives us the ability to be a voting delegate on behalf of WDHA.



Wednesday evening we attended the Plenary Session that reviews the resolutions. It allows the proponent of each Resolution the opportunity to express the intent of the Resolution and speak to the reasons for bringing it to Convention for a delegate vote. Following are the 2017 Resolutions and there outcome. The resolution that sparked the most interest was Resolution 4 "Co Ownership and Eligibility to Show in JO and AO Classes without Restriction." When we discussed the resolutions at the WDHA November meeting we decided we would vote against this resolution. When this resolution came to the floor for vote, a standing vote, your WDHA delegates voted against it but majority ruled and it was passed. Any approved resolutions marked "yes" under extraordinary become effective December 31st, 2017. Any marked "no" under extraordinary become effective December 31st, 2018.

In the "President's State of the Association Address" given by President Nancy Harvey she said.....The state of our association is good but could it be better, yes, but it will take us working together to make it better. We are still involved with the law suit with the PB Arabian Trust and it has taken a toll on us financially, both in staff and in volunteer time. A court date has been set for March 2018. As part of future state, the first phase was rolled out a year ago with the implementation of the new accounting system, Multi-View, and pleased to say it was under budget. The next phase,



membership, is in full swing, is under budget, with the plan to roll out in February. In January AHA hosted its first ever meeting of those members who show exclusively in the breeding and in-hand division. We listened to their concerns and suggestions to improve this division and changes were made to the US Nationals in the breeding and in-hand division. This year marked the 15th anniversary of the Sport horse Nationals, 25th anniversary of the Youth Nationals, 60th anniversary of the Canadian Nationals, and 51st anniversary of the US Nationals. In August the BODs created a new venue for entry level participants called the Arabian Value Show. This is an expansion on the Arabian one-day show but in a multi-day format. This will be rolled out for the 2018 competitions to make shows more affordable for smaller horse populations. The AHA one-day show will go back to its original format and can only be held using a small 'r' judge. The new AHA value show may be held 1 to 3 days in length and can use a small 'r', large "R", or specialty judge. We are all trying to determine how to move the association forward and expand our portion of the equestrian customer base. I believe we need to work at the grass-roots level and change the way look at our goals. We need to start thinking more about riding Arabians rather than owning Arabians. We have a great product and if we get people riding or just experiencing our Arabians, the rest will come but we must pursue the people who may be interested in an Arabian. So, we are creating a grassroots development committee to look at the way we can reach out, use the tools available, find new tools to work at the local level, to make it easy for people to ride and experience the Arabian horse.



Julie M Broadway from the American Horse Council explained they are an advocate for the social, economic, and legislative interests of the United States Equine Industry. AHC are horse people working for the Horse Industry and are vital to the long term success of the Industry. Our focus areas are Legislative &

Regulatory Advocacy, Industry and Regulatory Liaison, Economy & Taxes! Tax Bulletin and Booklet, Industry Sustainability & Growth, Industry Visibility, and Education, and Leadership Development. We have been working with the Department of Agriculture regarding the PAST (Prevent All Soring Tactics) Act/Horse Protection Act and they have listened to us. We are also working on double decker trailer prohibition, trails access, and something that has come up recently the electronic logging devices exception for livestock.

The Keynote Address was giving by Ann Judge and Sharon Magness-Blake, and you guessed it "Thunder" was there. For 25 years Sharon-



Magness-Blake as been the proud owner of all the Thunders and has had the most incredible experiences with every one of them. As a young girl Sharon grew up very poor and was an abused child so she escaped by



reading every horse book that she could find in the library and wished for a home and an husband where she could keep her horses close by her. How do we honor the Arabian horse, community first! We are constantly involving

Thunder in education with the community and we have taken him to boys and girls clubs, parties, and so many more to mention but one of her favorites is the Stock Show. Again Thunder is going to be the grand marshal this year and no matter where we take him we are always asked, what kind of a horse is he. He is an Arabian. Education is another way to honor the Arabian horse but she is not sure who has received more education. The people who ask the questions, the kids in the schools, or herself. Sharon have learned so much through these horses.

Ann Judge has been an active participant in the horse industry since 1976. Her judging is long and prestigious, having judged the U.S., Youth, and Canadian Arabian Nationals. She was so thrilled when they were called and asked to be the keynote speaker and when they found out the theme for convention was "honor" they were ecstatic because that is what they try to do all the time. We need to honor what we do, honor the horse, and honor our team. Another way we can honor the Arabian horse is through kindness. As a judge, she loves



judging and continually try to get better at it and within the parameter of the rules we can be kind. Within this day and age we have to assert that kindness. Horse will go though fire for us, if they believe in us, and we partner with them, they will go through fire for us. And it is that kind of faith exhibitors come into the show ring and so as a judge she wants to try to answer that faith with kindness, fairness, and honesty. Thunder has changed the world as far as the way the world has seen the Arabian horse, but you all have Thunders too. You all are the Thunder, all of you. You are the fingers that go out of this body and you change your little corner of the world.



Friday afternoon the Regional Level Volunteer Service Awards were presented. Gail Rentmeester and Hillary Hoffman were awarded the Regional Level Volunteer Service award for Region X. Congratulations Gail for everything that you do for WDHA, the youth, and the Arabian



Most social clubs, even if established to promote an agenda or a product, depend upon volunteers to carry out the club's business. This appears especially true in the Arabian horse world, where the entire governing structure, from national officers through regional and local club governing bodies depend upon people's volunteered time, services, and sometimes, even money, to conduct business and promote the breed.

Currently, the combined efforts of AHA Region 10 clubs in Wisconsin (WAHA, WDHA, and Spirit) will represent the Arabian breed with demonstrations, educational offerings, literature, and outreach efforts at Midwest Horse Fair in Madison April 20-22. Although some of the expense of bringing and stalling horses, lodging and daily entrance fees is being defrayed by promotional money from AHA Region 10 and AHA promotion, no one is reimbursed for their time or talent....either in planning or time on task.

Likewise, the Horse-A-Rama Tack Swap this coming Saturday, March 17, will see the WDHA Youth in attendance to talk about the developing online certification program which is being designed by WDHA Youth and Youth Director Gail Rentmeester. Again, time and talent are volunteered. The Youth will also be involved in promoting the club, the Arabian horse, and Youth activities at the Circle E Equestrian Center Tack Swap on April 7.

Plans are in place (budget, clinician, facilty) for a clinic on Western Dressage to be held, also at Circle E Equestrian Center, Seymour, on April 28. All preplanning and service at the event by club members is voluntary.

The Badger Classic Show Committee has met in person and through phone and email communications to draft a class list, hire judges and officials, secure facility, insurance, publish the prize list, and advertise the event, to be held May 25-27. Once more, all Show Committee time and talent are volunteered without reimbursement.

Volunteerism (continued)

The fact that event committees are aleady in place does not mean that the need for volunteers has disappeared. **On** the contrary, the events themselves are in sore need of people. Sometimes it means taking responsibility for making sure that materials needed for the event get to the event in a timely fashion. Maybe it means standing around looking friendly, inviting people to discussion, and answering questions (many of them silly). At the shows, it might mean opening and closing a gate or handing out ribbons or running tests and paperwork to the show office.

Right now, I know that Youth Director Gail Renmeester could use another body or two at the Circle E Tack Swap on April 7 and at the WDHA Western Dressage Clinic on April 28. Contact Gail at riding.master@yahoo.com

Midwest Horse Fair Coordinator, Vikki Dalton, has put out a plea for volunteers to help, especially during the times when our Arabians will be on display at the Andis "clip joint," when additional horse handlers might be needed or people to replace those handlers back at the Pavillion to meet and greet. Any time volunteering to welcome interest, hand out hippology tests, share literature, and field questions at the breed display area is not only welcome but needed. The Badger Classic could use a number of volunteers, especially at the Sport Horse Arena, where scribes for in-hand classes, a ringmaster for the under saddle classes, an announcer to handle gait calls for the SHUS classes, gate manager, and ribbon distributers are all needed. The WDHA Futurity offers both halter and performance classes for yearlings through five year olds. Foals are nominated in utero and maintained in the program through their five year old year with annual nominations. Through generous support of the annual Awards Banquet Silent auction, raffles, and drawings, every year supplemental funds are added to the nomination fees. For example, last year, **every entry** at the show had over \$50 added to its respective class.

Last year, and again for 2018, WDHA is adding \$100 per futurity class, plus the added per entry raffle money PLUS nomination fees to all Futurity classes.

~ BREEDERS BONUS FOR 2018 ~

IN ADDITION, all mare nominations (pregnant mares to foal in 2018) made by an extended January 20 deadline are eligible for a one time BREEDERS BONUS. **Every mare owner submitting a mare nomination by January 20** may do so without penalty and have their name placed in a drawing for a \$100 Breeders Bonus. The drawing will take place at the WDHA Awards Banquet and Gathering on February 3.

Mare nominations may still be made after January 20, but the owner will not be eligible for the Breeders Bonus and will be charged a \$25 late entry fee. Likewise, nominations and renominations for existing foals may be made anytime during the year, but there will be a \$25 penalty fee assessed, along with any delinquent nomination fees.

In another exhibitor/member friendly move, the membership decided at the January WDHA General Meeting to permit nominations/late entries of **BOTH Futurity and Maturity horses up to 6:00 p.m. Friday** the day before the first day of the WDHA Open Show/Futurity Festival (held September 8-9, 2018, Sunnyview Expo, Oshkosh)

The WDHA Purebred and Partbred Futurity consists of two divisions: The Breeder's Halter Division and the Breeder's Performance Division

Halter Division
Driving Division
Saddleseat Division
Huntseat Division
Western Division

AWARDS

- I. The original nomination fee for the Halter Division will be split twelve ways and will be added to the purse of each class the unborn foal is eligible to show in as a yearling, two-year old, three-year old, etc.. Weanling classes are jackpotted classes only. Should a foal be entered late, the fee will be divided into the remaining classes for which the foal is eligible.
- 2. The original nomination and first sustaining payments for the Performance Futurity will be divided eight ways. The other re-nomination and entry fees will go only into those classes that the foal is eligible to show in.
- 3. In all divisions the prize money will be divided according to the number of horses shown. The cost of the trophies, ribbons, and any related expenses may be deducted. Money distribution percentages are as follows:

One horse - 100% Two horses - 60%, 40% Three horses - 50%, 30%, 20% Four horses - 40%, 30%, 20%, 10% Five or more - 35%, 25%, 20%, 12 .5%, 7.5% Six (weanlings) - 33%,23%,18%,13%,8%,5%
