ALL FEES MUST BE PAID IN U.S. FUNDS

CLOSE OF ENTRIES/POST ENTRIES

- Entries whose qualifications were earned <u>before</u> the close-of entry-date must be postmarked by **June 1st** to be eligible for the early entry fees.
- Entries who qualify on or after the close-of-entry date may enter until 6:00 P.M. on Friday, June 25th at the pre-entry fee. Exhibitors are encouraged to enter classes as early as possible.

Important!! Entries for horses qualifying after the June 1st deadline must be either <u>received</u> by the show secretary no later than June 12th or hand delivered to the show office up until 6:00 P.M. Friday June 25th. Exhibitors with questions on the best method to enter late qualifying horses are welcome to email the show secretary.

STABLING (see also General Information)

- All horses entered must have a stall.
 - o Box stalls (10'x10') with fixed fronts and tack stalls are available: \$85 per stall
- Availability of stall location is on a first-come basis.
- Bedding is available for purchase at \$9/bag, 2 bag minimum. Please see Barn Manager or put on entry form.
- Tack stalls may be limited if entries warrant.
- Absolutely no stalls will be held without payment in full at the closing of pre-entries.
- Stalls will be available noon on *Friday, June 25th.* All horses must depart by Sunday night unless other arrangements are made with the competition barn manager. If you are planning to come on Wednesday or Thursday, please be aware that there will be an additional stall fee as well as an office fee as each horse must have a number during show hours.
- **Stall Deposit.** A separate check for \$25.00 is to be left in the show office to cover stall cleaning should you decide not to clean your stall. Your check will be returned to you once the barn manager has checked your stall. This check will only be deposited if your stall is not cleaned.

AWARDS AND PREMIUMS - All prize money will be distributed in the show office or awards area, signature required. Prize money will NOT be mailed. NOTE: In classes offering payback, no payback awarded if only five (5) or fewer horses are shown.

Top Five Awards	Top Five Awards will be made regardless of the number of entries in a class. However, only awards make to the top 50% of the class (rounded up and not to exceed five [5] awards) will receive Sweepstakes payout, AHA Horse Achievement Award, Amateur Achievement Award (Adult and Youth), and High Point Horse and High Point Amateur Achievement Award Points.

CAMPING FEES: \$35 per night. All camping is to be arranged with the Show Office and can be paid on your entry form. There are 199 campsites. There are water hook ups as well as electric hookups. Each electric hook up has 50W, 30W, and 20W connections. There is an on-site dumping station. There are also seasonal shower facilities.

Pets are allowed, but they must be leashed and waste cleaned up.

CLASS SPONSORSHIPS/ PATRONS - see sponsorship/patron form

- Championship Show Patrons \$400. Patronships paid no later than June 1st receive a patron welcome gift and two bags of ice. Additional gift delivered daily to your stalls, preferred stabling, and four (4) Region 10 class sponsorships (includes garlands, cooler, ribbons) as well as public recognition by the announcer during the classes sponsored.
 - Patron Stabling Policy: Preferred stabling requests will be considered based on Patronships postmarked by close of entry June 1st, rather than Patron payment postmark date. Effort will be made to honor stabling request based on Patron's stabling location the past several years.
- Championship Class Sponsorships
 - Level 1 \$50 per class. Sponsorships paid no later than close of early entry, June 1st will receive preferred stabling after Patrons and one (1) Region 10 class sponsorship of cooler and ribbons.
 - Level 2 \$100 per class sponsorships also sponsor flower garlands

IMPORTANT ENTRY INFORMATION – please read before completing entry forms

- 1. Only <u>one</u> horse entry per entry blank; use an additional entry blank if the same owner is entering additional horses. No horse may be entered on more than one entry form per show.
- 2. Farm name may not be used unless stable or farm is the owner appearing on the registration papers, or the stable or farm has been registered with USEF and the number noted on the space provided on the entry form. A copy of the USEF Farm Registration Certificate should accompany the entry.
- 3. To facilitate handling of entries, please follow the instructions below carefully.
- 4. Junior exhibitors are 18 and under as of their actual age on December 1, 2020.
- 5. No entry numbers will be given without stall deposit.

Complete copy of registration papers for each horse entered, showing ownership and registration information. If
the owner's name on the registration papers is different than on the entry for the horse, an affidavit, a copy of the
sales contract, or authorization form must be on file with the show office.
Negative Coggins Test. BRING THE ORIGINAL COGGINS ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW!! Wisconsin requires negative COGGINS TEST, dated within the current calendar year. Original report form or a health certificate with date of Coggins test must be presented prior to horse being unloaded at the show. Coggins must be legible. The State of Wisconsin requires a health certificate for all horses entering the state. For clarification, use horse's show name on the Coggins test and not his stable name. Send photocopy with entry form.
Equine Influenza & Herpes Virus Vaccine Documentation —Within Last 6 Months: Documentation of administration within the last 6 months for the Equine Influenza & Herpes Virus vaccines must be sent in with stall request form. A copy will also need to be presented and left in the Show Office if not sent in with stall request form. Horses will not be allowed off of trailers without proper documentation.
Copy of current USEF membership card for each owner, trainer, rider, driver, and handler. Adult exhibitors (19 and over) in amateur classes must have a USEF amateur designation. USEF Show Pass fee of \$45 will be assessed to individuals who are either not USEF members or cannot provide the required membership information
Copy of current AHA membership/competition card for each owner, trainer, rider, driver, and handler. AHA membership, with competition card, is required for all Championship classes.
Signatures are required for each owner, rider, driver, handler, coach whose name appears on the entry form. If ar exhibitor is under the age of 19, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, trainer, must sign the entry blank on the minors behalf.
AHA has waived qualifications for Regional classes.

TBA/OPTION CLASSES:

One class per division is offered as a TBA/Option class. These classes must be from the specific division they are located in, i.e. 1 in the Sporthorse In-hand division, 1 in the Sporthorse Under saddle division, 1 in the Western Dressage division and 1 in the Dressage division. The cost to have a class added is \$150 (does not include class entry). If there are 4 entries in the new class, the original \$150 will be returned to the person requesting the class.

If you are adding/requesting a TBA/Option class, this must be done by the deadline for pre-entries (June 1, 2021) so we can inform others of the addition to the class list.

GENERAL INFORMATION

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

- 1. **AHA QUALIFICATIONS**: AHA has waived qualifications for this show for 2020 only.
- 2. **CHANGES**: The Show Committee reserves the right to make such changes in procedures, personnel, rules and regulations as shall be deemed by them to be in the best interest of the shows.
- 3. **OFFICIALS**: In the event that due to illness or failure of a Show Official to attend the shows or perform his/her duties, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute a Show Official.
- 4. CANCELLATION OR SUBSTITUTION OF ENTRIES: Exhibitors cancelling their entries for any reason after the official entry closing date shall forfeit office fees. No substitution of horses will be permitted. Entry fee refunds will be made only with the presentation of an acceptable veterinarian certificate which must be on file with the Show Secretary by the end of the Show. Once a horse is on the grounds, the entry fee refund will only be made with the presentation of an acceptable veterinarian's certificate from the official Show Veterinarian. Stall refunds will be made at the discretion of Show Management.
- 5. **POST MARKS/CLOSE OF PRE-ENTRIES**: U.S. Government postmark dates will be used. Metered postmarks are not acceptable. Close of pre-entries for horses qualified by that date is June 1st
- 6. USEF FEES:
 - a. A \$23 Federation Fee will be collected & remitted to USEF or every horse entered in the competition. (\$15 D&M + \$8).
 - b. Individuals without a current USEF membership will be charged a \$45 USEF Show Pass (non-member) Fee.

7. AHA FEES:

- a. 9-90 Education/Evaluation Fee: \$15 per horse will be collected & remitted to AHA for Championship Show entries.
- b. AHA Recovery Charge of \$15.00 will be charged for each horse entered. This charge is only for the 2021 competition year only and is submitted in its entirety to AHA

8. REGISTRATION PAPERS:

- a. Purebred Arabian horses entered in the show must be registered with the Arabian Horse Registry of American and/or the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry.
- b. Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian horses entered in the show must be registered in the Half-Arabian and/or Anglo-Arabian Registry or have a CPAR permit.
- c. Horses must be entered in their full registered name. Registration number and sire and dam must appear on the entry blank.
- d. A copy of the registration papers showing ownership must be submitted with the entry form.

9. PAYMENTS:

- a. Credit/debit card: USEF has strongly recommended that all payments be made electronically. We have the entry forms and stabling info online at www.horseshowoffice.com.
- b. Open Checks: All pre-entries and stall reservations must be accompanied by fully negotiable checks (no "open checks") dated on or before the date of close of entries. Entries without such checks will be considered post entries and charged post entry fees; stalling priority will also be negated.
- c. NSF Checks: A **\$50** penalty will be assessed each time a check is presented to the Region 10 bank and returned due to non-sufficient funds. Previous violators may be asked to submit payment for the current year via certified check or money order.
- 10. **PHYSICAL INSPECTION**: All animals are subject to a physical inspection, at no charge, by the Show Veterinarian at the discretion of Show Committee as a safeguard against communicable diseases. Examination or treatment not requested by the Show Officials/management shall be on a private practice basis.

- 11. **STALLIONS**: May be shown by ladies and junior exhibitors. Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian stallions two years and over may compete in any performance class open to stallions.
- 12. **PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR**: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Please see the complete rule, USEF DR120.6.
- 13. **PETS**: All dogs or pets must be held on a leash of less than six (6) feet in length or otherwise restrained. Waste must be cleaned up.
- 14. OVERNIGHT CAMPING: see page 5
- 15. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: No alcoholic beverages may be brought onto the Fairgrounds.
- 16. **MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT**: (GR1301.7) Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- 17. **STABLING**: Please be aware that social distancing may still be in effect and health guidelines will impact stabling. Guidelines per USEF will be followed.
- 18. **PARKING**: All vehicles (other than camping vehicles and horse trailers) MUST park in the parking lot to the south of the competition rings
- 19. **ARENAS:** There are **3 outdoor** competition arenas (115' x 220', 80' x 200', and 150' x 250') with special sand, clay and compost mixture for footing. There are also 2 indoor competition arenas (105' x 105' and 80' x 80'). Tests so approved by US Equestrian Federation may be held in a small arena.
- 20. WARM-UP FACILITIES:
 - a. Warm-up areas will be designated by signage at the facility. For your protection, no grass warm up is available.
 - b. All horses have to be kept in designated areas for showing, exercising, and the access ways to these areas.
 - c. Any horse found to be led, ridden, or driven in any part of the grounds not so designated will be disqualified from the show and will forfeit entry fees as well as all winnings, trophies, and ribbons.
- 21. **RIDE TIMES:** Will be posted on horseshowoffice.com as well as emailed to a valid email address that is provided on the entry form no later than THREE (3) days prior to the start of the show. This is subject to any late entries. For those who may be entering late, please be aware that you may not receive your ride times until you check in.
- 22. **FIRE HAZARD LAW:** Aisles in barns must be open and not blocked in any way. If used, decorative material must be rendered and maintained flame retardant in accordance with state fire code (documentation required) and they must be retreated whenever washed or cleaned (document).
- 23. **STALL DECORATIONS**: Tops of stalls or aisles are not to be covered with any material. (See also Fire Hazard Law)
- 24. **SHARPS CONTAINERS**: Sharps containers for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments will be located in the barns. Competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- 25. **FARRIER:** An Official Show Farrier will be on-call. Contact information posted in show office and in the barns.
- 26. VETERINARIAN: Contact information posted in show office and in the barns.
- 27. **PRINTING ERRORS:** The Show Committee is not responsible for any errors in printing. Any corrections to the prize list will be posted in the Show Office.
- **28. EXHIBITOR REGISTRATION:** All exhibitors and their group (Trainer, groom, etc) MUST register in the Show Office and receive a wristband, which is to be worn during all show days. Temperatures should be self-monitored by the exhibitors.

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. 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USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Ádequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

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USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
