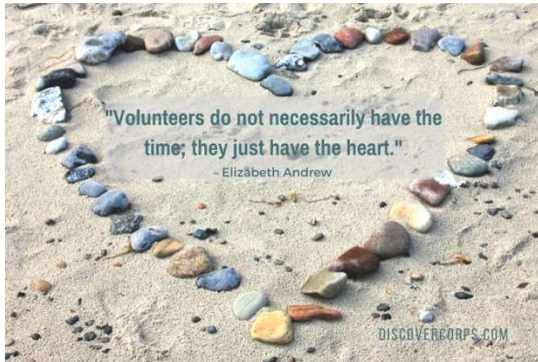

The WDHA Futurity offers both halter and performance classes for yearlings through five-year-olds. Foals are nominated in utero and maintained in the program through their five-year-old year with annual nominations. Through generous support of the annual Awards Banquet Silent auction, raffles, and drawings, every year supplemental funds are added to the nomination fees and in 2024 this resulted not only those recipients receiving 100% of their nominations, but an additional 150% from the raffle/silent auction.

Audrey Cunningham had a passion for Arabian horses that started back in 1965 when she and her husband married and moved to the country. They bought a yr old filly from a local farmer that came to live with my parents in their garage, turned into a barn. They had no fencing as it was winter and so she lunged and exercised the filly like a dog. And after a month of doing this, she stayed in the yard and was free to roam their 20-acre property, but she rarely left the lawn. They quickly jumped into the Arabian world joining WDHA and was the secretary for a while.



She eventually met Madge Guina from Hillcrest Arabians and there Audrey bought a variety of young stock. Gene Rickardt was the trainer, showed halter, so they headed off to the A shows and they never looked back. Their last purchase was HC Mannix ++. Audrey had fallen in love with the English pleasure horses and saw the worth in having an animal that could be shown, make some money, and not have to breed a herd of horses because now is the 80's and all those tax shelters were gone.

After her divorce and not sure about the farm and what the future would hold, she sent Mannix to Jerry McRay. At the time Larry Hoffman was training there, so he rode Mannix that season winning Region 10,11, and 6 and taking a top 20 at the Arabian Nationals. Audrey took Jerry's advice and brought Mannix home and let her daughter of 17 take the reins. Over the next 12 yrs they won numerous regional open and amateur awards.

Audrey loved this horse, he was a true gentleman, and she promoted that Arabian horse at horse fairs and he even was the lead parade horse at our western rodeo parade a few times. He loved it all and she loved him. In her personal world she took those broodmares and turned them into lesson horses. She was a teacher, so she took that skill and found a way to stay on the farm. In the summers she would have girl scout camps, and those girls learned more than just how to ride or feed a horse she taught them about the Arabian horse.

Mannix rests under an apple tree in my back yard, and a dusting of Audrey rests with him.

Of all the resolutions, resolution “#2 AHA Bylaw Governance Change” caused the most chatter and although disapproved (did not meet 2/3<sup>rd</sup>s vote) it was widely supported. The 2025 AHA governing staff will be revisiting it to bring back to convention in 2025. It is also time for you to sign up for any 2025 committees you want to be a part of. To signup log into to your AHA account and go to <https://www.arabianhorses.org/login/leadership/committeeSignup>.

AHA will be outsourcing prior employees who are familiar with the current system to move things along more quickly in migrating AHA off the Oracle 8i system. Any requests for updates that involve the current system will be put on hold until AHA has been migrated off Oracle 8i. 2024 major milestones included migrated Multiview to the cloud environment, migrated 4.5 million show results and 90K miscellaneous results from 8i to 19C, 55 new enrollments in the Recreation Riding Program since the release in November, Board motions for dressage and leveling, Discover Farm Waiver requirement, and Data Exchange with USEF. The Executive Director goals for 2025 include increase outreach in promoting the Arabian horse outside of horse shows, continue success planning and staff cross training, major sponsorships for national events, and developing a culture of growth and cohesiveness. Other plans for 2025 are ACH payment option for customers, Oracle 8i migration of performance and halter futurities, random prize money and batching, Multiview upgrade, and DNA for Half-Arabians.

**National Shows.** Youth and Mid-Summer Nationals number of horses was under budget and entries were over budget. Highlights of the show were a tour of the new coliseum, a lesson programs meeting, and young trainers & AHYA meeting with the commission. Distance Nationals entries were under budget and highlights of the show were increased social media following, great location, weather, and management. Ranch Horse Championships horses and entries were both under budget and things tried were all breed classes, events to involve all competitors, and great location and facilities. Sport Horse Nationals number of horses was under budget, but entries were over budget. Highlights included a roving barn party, jog party, and patron gifts. US Nationals number of horses was even, and entries were over budget. Highlights included improvements to decorations, New Theme “Dream, Achieve, Remember”, exciting closing ceremonies, welcome party for exhibitors, and great social media involvement.

**The New Leveling** will be available December 2<sup>nd</sup> and the new view will contain leveling for Ranch Rail and Ranch Riding. Note the views are for “Local/Regional” shows and “Nationals Shows” and an exhibitor can be a Choice rider at the Local/Regional and Select at the National level.

**The Marketing Growth** future plan is to adopt a more inclusive marketing strategy with efforts to expand the association’s reach, not just among national show participants, but to a broader audience aiming to attract newcomers, enthusiasts, and participants at all stages of their journey with Arabian horses. It is important to broaden the appeal of the Arabian horses and increase visibility through various initiatives such as educational content, social media outreach, and collaborations with media, sponsors, and community partners. Plans are to grow the association by storytelling around the Arabian Horses’ legacy and unique qualities, host a series of breed specific webinars, increase visibility at non-competitive and recreational riding events as trail rides, fairs and local 4-H or Pony Club activities. For 2025 goals are to expand educational programs, broaden partnerships and collaborations, and grow marketing and member programs. There were **40 Meet an Arabian Horse** events held in 2024, distribution of \$20,225 in grant funding, and they reached over 100k people.





## “Free First Year Jr. Membership”

Members joined through word of mouth or lesson programs, 84% own an Arabian or Half Arabian, 50% involved in lesson programs, 33% 4-H, and 28% in Home School Groups, 76% say horses are their primary hobby, and 64% likely to renew membership with 33% maybe. Membership retention benefits to include AHAcademy, Online Contests, Email Marketing Campaign, and ARRP (Arabian Recreational Rider Program).

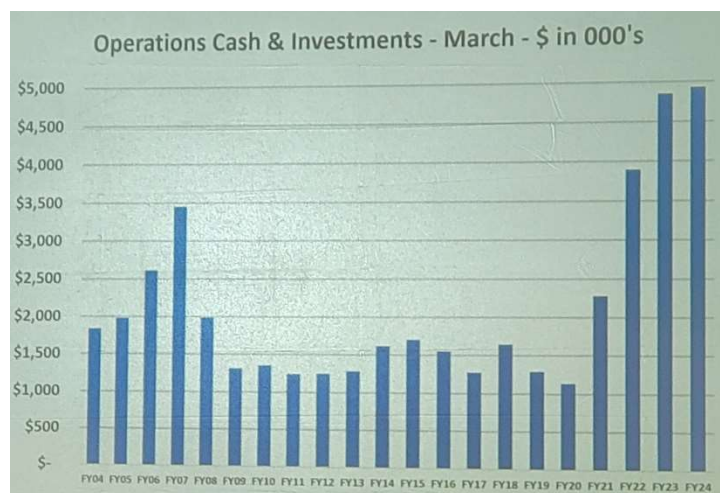
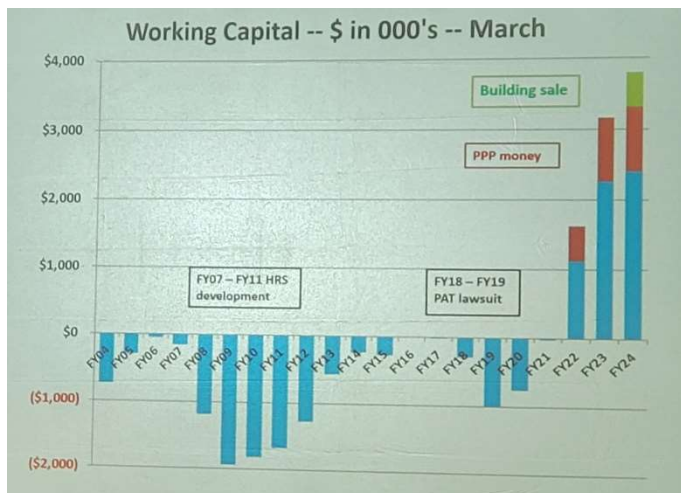

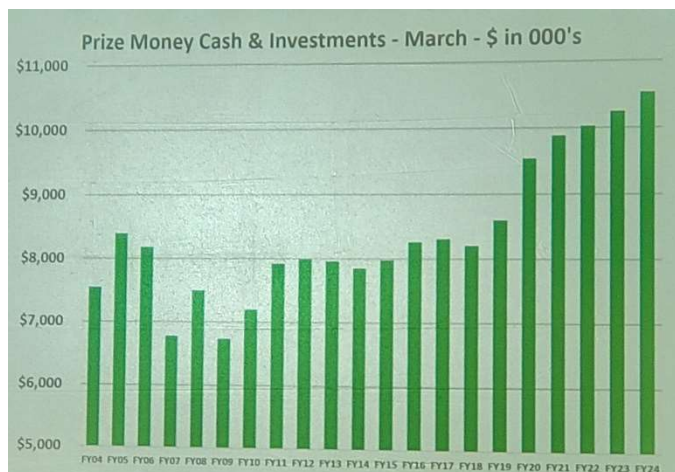
Working capital does not include Sweepstakes & Futurity program cash – only operations cash is included. AHA takes a conservative approach to calculating working capital:
