What is the future of showing the Arabian Horse?

As we observe the beautiful pictures from Youth Nationals, Mid Summer, and multiple regionals, we are in awe of the beautiful horses and horse/rider accomplishments. But, not all Arabian horses are national/regional caliber and while some regional horse numbers are growing, many other regional and local show horse numbers are dramatically down and the clubs that sponsor them are struggling for these local show opportunities to survive. Not all Arabian horse owners/exhibitors can afford or have the horse to show at regional and national levels and showing at local shows may be their pinnacle of success and what is wrong with that! Local shows are AHA's foundation for new horses, young horses, new exhibitors/owners/trainers and current members who do not have the horse or financially can not afford the horse or the expenses to AHA Showing Pyramid Chart show at the regional/national levels. AHA has said itself "Determining



qualifications have never been as simple as often thought. In recent

years at the encouragement of the BOD, the CAC (competition advisory commission) has tried to make qualification decisions that help encourage participation at the local and regional level, as we have become a top heavy industry. Local participation is vital to the success and longevity of the Arabian Breed. Local shows are truly the breeding ground for new members, new owners, new exhibitors, and new trainers. Additionally, they are the financial lifeline for local clubs, creating the financial means by which a club exists, and functions in order to promote the Arabian and Half Arabian Horse. In essence local shows are one of the best and likely the most important marketing tools the Arabian Breed has." Unfortunately, AHA actions have spoken louder than their words and is AHA becoming a breed organization for only the regional/national shows or is AHA an organization to promote and recognize all competition levels of the Arabian horse and their accomplishments?

For curiosity I kept track of horses I knew that showed at US Nationals in 2021. Exhibitors/owners/trainers prepared their horses for the highest level of competition, reached deep in their pockets to cover the entry fees/travel/other show expenses, and left for the show with the anticipation and aspiration of showing and coming home with a ribbon. But reality is only 37% of those 107 entries came home with a ribbon leaving 67% empty handed and disheartened. US Nationals had 1000+ entries so potentially there were 670 entries that came home empty handed. There is a place for that 67% but we are at a moment of truth if local shows will survive and there is a chance that that 67% will give up on the Arabian horse breed and get out of horses or go elsewhere.

You do have a voice and if you are concerned about the future of your club and the local shows it sponsors, it is time you write AHA. It is time to encourage AHA to take a look at what their actions have caused at the ground level. As clubs dissolve, shows disappear, so does the Arabian Horse Association and the Arabian breed. For the breed to grow it needs to grow from the ground up, it will not from the top down.



 - b. The horse has an outstanding history in competition

 - d. The horse has been an outstanding family horse and family friend
