CONVENTION 2021

2021 convention was scheduled to be in Niagara Falls on the Canadian side but with the uncertainty of border crossing into Canada, AHA Convention was again virtual in 2021. With a virtual convention it is possible to attend many more meetings then at a face to face convention. Meetings were scheduled Monday – Saturday 10:00 am – 6:00 pm and with having attended so many meetings, I was about meeting out. But I was able to provide day to day

updates to WDHA Officers, BODs, committee chairs which would not be possible with a face to face convention. Please see attached the schedule of events and any meeting highlighted in green are meetings I attended.

A deciding factor on what meetings I chose to attend are the resolutions that committee had been assigned. Most of the meeting provide a Q&A and poll the committee members and take a straw vote on approval or disapproval of the resolution. Through this process recommendations are made to the committee on rewording, additions, corrections of a resolution and in some cases a resolution is referred or withdrawn. Resolution 21-2 "Change to the Rule on Violation of the Shoe Measurement" was referred to the Equine Stress/Research & Education Committee and Resolution 21-15 "Announcing Exact Placings at Regionals and Nationals" was withdrawn. Track A

The Competition Advisory Committee discussed the "AHA Approved Qualifications" approved by the AHA BODs on Sept 28, 2021. Briefly for a horse to compete at the Regional and National level

- Qualification period is the previous year plus the current year up to the close of entries
- Compete in any qualifying AHA Recognized show in any region
- An Amateur must qualify the horse to participate in an Amateur or Amateur Owner class
- Compete in a recognized section
- Compete in any recognized class within that section
- Participate in that one recognized class in that section now qualifies you to compete in as many classes within that section at any one Regional Championship Show of your choice
- Participate at two (2) AHA Qualifying Shows and compete at any and as many Regional Championships in that section

I, along with other AHA members wrote letters throughout 2021 to AHA officers, BODs, and competition advisory board committee members expressing our disagreement with this qualification proposal. With no qualifications in 2020 and 2021 many did not support local shows and instead attended multiple regional and national shows. As a result the Arabian Horse Showing Pyramid is dying from the ground up and I am asking you to support your local shows. We all need the local shows to prepare ourselves and our horses and without your support by attendance and financially, the clubs that sponsor them no longer will be able to.

At the Amateur Committee AHA VP Lisa Blackstone discussed the USEF rules changes that will go into effect 2022 regarding four amateur rule changes. Briefly

- Allow amateur rule changes. Briefly
 Allow amateurs in specific breeds and disciplines to teach introductory lessons to non-competing riders
- Allow amateurs in specific breeds and disciplines to teach introductory lessons
 Let amateurs be social media influencers and social media brand ambassadors
- Allowing amateurs to do paid barn work, to include lunging
- Any professional 25 years or younger may reapply for amateur status after a three-month waiting period.


