Karl S. Fleig has served as the national director of Royal Rangers since July 2014. Karl has been involved in Rangers since 1985,



when he attended National Training Camp (NTC). Since that time he has served in multiple positions in the local outpost and on district staff for Royal Rangers. Prior to his present position, Karl served the Indiana District Council as the Christian Education and Men's Ministries director for 13 years from 2001 to 2014. He pastored Bethel Assembly, Huntington, IN (1995-2001), and he pastored and youth pastored in Chicago, IL (1987-1995). He also youth pastored in Hallsville, TX and served a

one-year MAPS assignment in the Southeast Pacific. Karl was credentialed by the Ohio District Council in 1985 and is a graduate of Central Bible College (1985) in Springfield MO. Karl and his wife, Cindy, have a daughter and two sons.

Hello Ohio Ranger Outpost Leaders,

We are continuing with online registration this year with a goal of 100% registration online. However, this year we have some exciting developments that you will hopefully find beneficial and increase the adoption of online registration. Why online registration? It helps the network to plan and to make sure that we have the proper resources on hand prior to the camp starting. This includes, hats or t-shirts, and the camp meal. We want to make sure that everyone has the same great experience at Pow-Wow.

So, new this year are group registrations, if you are familiar with Kids or Youth Camp you are given a group code to use when you register. This will serve a couple benefits. First, as the outpost leader, you will be able to log in and see who is registered for the event. Second, if your church pays for portion or all your boys to attend you can set up a sponsorship. This way when they register there will be no payment due and all payment will be collected from the sponsoring church. This will also help to streamline who and how much the boys are paying.

Below, you will find two sets of instructions. The first will be for the group leader and how to set up the group code. The second should be passed on to the boys or the parents to register and walk them through the process to make sure they register correctly.

Group Leader Instructions (Leaders Complete this First)

- 1. In a web browser, navigate to www.ohioministry.net/login
- 2. Log in using the same credentials you used last year or create an account.
- 3. Once you are logged in, click "Reservations" across the top bar.
- 4. Select "New Reservation"
- 5. Click "Group Reservation"
- 6. Select Royal Ranger Pow-Wow 2025 and follow the steps. You will need to entered an estimated number of boys and leaders attending, estimate higher than you think it will be so you don't need to adjust the number later.
- a. For description, use your Outpost or Church Name
- b. Select 'yes' to require campers to enter a code.
- c. Enter a Church ID code. We recommend a code that is 6 characters in length and includes your Outpost number.
- d. If the church plans to pay for all or a portion of the boy and leaders registration, you will need to follow the steps to also set up a Sponsorship by clicking 'yes' to "will your church be contributing..."
- e. Follow the prompts to set up the sponsorship.
- 7. Once you have completed the steps, you will check out. No payment needs to be submitted at this time.
- 8. Navigate back to your account dashboard and click 'Reservations'
- 9. You should see a 'Royal Rangers Pow-Wow 2025 (Group Preorder)' under your reservation history. If you click on it you will be able to copy a direct link you can send to your outpost to register.
- 10. Distribute the group code, link and registration instructions to your Outpost.
- 11. You can log back into your portal to see the boys who have registered.

Registering for Pow-Wow with a Group

- Parents should log into <u>www.ohioministry.net/login</u> using the same login credentials as last year or the same credentials they used for Kids or Youth Camp. This will reduce the amount of data entry and will pull from previous reservations.
- 2. Select 'Reservations' across the top bar.
- 3. Select New Reservation
- 4. Select 'Individual Reservation'
- 5. Click the name of the boy or leader you want to register
- 6. On the next screen you will see big red letters that says "CLICK HERE if you belong to a group that has reserved space" Click on this if you have been given a group code. Otherwise, scroll down and select Royal Ranger Pow-Wow 2025 and follow the prompts.
- 7. Enter your provided group code in the group code box and click next.
- 8. Confirm your group and click select.
- 9. Follow the prompts, completing all fields and then click complete order.
- 10. If you are registering more than one child or a parents and child, you will see a link to add 'additional reservation' under the 'complete order' button. Do this for each additional person from the same family.

POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Heartland Conference Retreat Center

Thank you for keeping Heartland Conference Retreat Center a smoke and alcohol free environment across the entire grounds of 356 acres.

- 1. Modest swimwear is required by anyone using the pool and surrounding area. Ladies and girls must wear modest one-piece bathing suits. Men and boys must wear modest swimming trunks. At each swimming session at least one person from each group renting the pool needs to 'monitor' the bathing suits upon entrance to the pool area. Lifeguards should not be distracted by having to monitor the bathing suits.
- 2. A cover-up (not a beach towel) is to be worn to and from the pool area. The cover-up needs to be worn over bathing suits and swimming trunks anywhere on Heartland property when not at the pool area.
- 3. Swimming is allowed only when there are lifeguards on duty at the pool.
- 4. Each hour the lifeguards are required by law to take a 15 minute break. All swimmers must exit the pool during the required breaks.
- 5. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times on Heartland property.
- 6. No food or drinks are allowed inside the fenced area. Food and drinks are permitted outside the pool area.
- 7. Diving Area: Only those who pass the swimming test and have a valid wristband are permitted in the diving area. Anyone in violation of this rule will lose all pool privileges, possibly for the remainder of the scheduled event. No backward dives or flips. No swimming in the diving area. Swim to the ladder, not under the ropes. Wait for the person in front of you to get to the ladder before diving. Jump off the diving board forward, not to the side.
- 8. Swim Test Rules: You are required to swim the width of the pool on one side without stopping and swim the front crawl.
- 9. General Rules: No Running, horseplay, pushing, shoving or pulling people into the pool. No jumping or diving off the sides of the pool at any time. No food or drink inside the pool area. Stay in area of pool where you can touch bottom. No flotation devises that have a hole in the middle, such as inner tubes.
- 10. Above all the lifeguard's decision in any matter is final and will not be disputed with the patrons.
