OHIO LEADERSHIP TRAINING ACADEMY

Requirements:

Age 18 and over

Purpose:

To train, equip, and empower men with godly wisdom and instruction so that they, in turn, can evangelize, equip, and empower the next generation of Christ-like men and lifelong servant leaders in their community and church.

Society's Need:

In an increasingly fatherless society, a clarion call echoes throughout the land for godly men to arise, take their place, and mentor the next generation. In 2017, we held our 25th Junior Leadership Training Academy. In those 25 years, we have seen over 4,000 boys attend our various camps with over 110 boys earning their tomahawk and well over 400 earning their sabers.

As we begin our 26th year of training boys to be Christ-like servant leaders, we see the need to start "The Leader's Training Academy" as a part of "The Ohio Leadership Training Academy." At its heart, Royal Rangers is a mentoring ministry. The core of our mission, which is to evangelize, equip and empower young men, is found in the weekly Bible studies designed to sharpen the heart of godly young men, giving the Biblical view of true manhood, cultural issues, a Biblical worldview, doctrine and sexuality throughout the Bible. We encourage side-by-side mentoring as men and boys work together.

The Leader's Training Academy will encourage men to be mentors, equip them with sound tools and resources, and model this boy-led, adult-facilitated method of teaching. Our goal is to raise an army of well-equipped men of God to march alongside the pastor in battle for the souls of this generation, meeting the needs of our society in various ways.

Our vehicle to reach our goals will be the use of "Action Camps" which exist in our current Academy along with an additional camp called the "Leader's Training Camp." This will take place concurrently with "The Academy."

Upon completion of the 5 camps, the leader will receive a "Solomon's Sword" in recognition of his achievement and as a symbol of the wisdom gained and to be imparted into the lives of young men.

A special ceremony will be held at the conclusion of "The Leadership Training Academy."

Plan:

LTC 1st Year

This camp will include the teaching of Ranger Basics, Ranger Essentials, First Aid, CPR and Safety in the Church. The leader will have completed the Ready and Safety requirements necessary to earn the Medal of Excellence.

HIGH TECH TRACK 2nd thru 4th Year

This camp trail is held in conjunction with The Academy and is an Action Camp Trail for leaders. It is based upon the (Green) Computer and (Gold) Communications merits of the Adventure Rangers program. Not all requirements can or need to be completed in camp, but most will be touched upon. A second and third level of this camp consists of photography, videography and robotics.

TRAILRANGER TRACK 2nd thru 4th Year

This camp trail is held in conjunction with The Academy and is an Action Camp Trail for leaders. It is based on advanced camping techniques and outdoor adventure that consists of 3 specific camps:

Backcountry Leadership – In this camp, you will be introduced to camping skills, backpacking, and survival skills used in the back country.

Canoeing- Young men are introduced to the water through Canoeing Skills. Skills include safety, how to control a canoe, and rescue scenarios.

High Adventure – this camp is designed around high energy, fast paced challenges that young men must work through to accomplish the same goal. Activities will include High Ropes Course, Low Ropes Course, as well as the shooting range.

THE CRUCIBLE 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Year

This camp is held the first weekend of February each year and can be used as a substitute for one year of either the High-Tech trail or Trail Ranger Camp.

TASC 5th Year

The Academy Service Camp is developed to place the young men in the thick of servant leadership, all while learning valuable life skills. Skills include First Aid, CPR, AED Fundamentals, Search and Rescue Techniques, and most importantly chaplaincy skills. This camp will run the week of Pow-wow and concludes on Sunday Morning at the close of Pow-wow.

Earns a Solomon's Sword upon completion of 5 camps

* If an attendee has completed any of the above camps, they will not have to take that camp again in order to earn Solomon's Sword, regardless of when they took it.



TRAIL TO THE SABER

SABER OVERVIEW

In order for a boy to earn the Ohio Saber, he must attend and complete Ohio Training Camp, JTC, 3 camps of a specific Trail of his choice and the TASC Camp. His last camp of the 5 must be TASC. He will not be able to mix and match camps - he must complete 1 full trail in order. He can attend other camps as he pleases but will only earn the saber when he has completed JTC, 1 full Trail, as described below, and then TASC Camp.

ENTRY CAMP INTO THE ACADEMY:

- **Ohio Training Camp (7th grade)** – This camp will be based primarily on teaching leadership skills and will be boy-led, adult-facilitated.

CAMPING TRAIL:

- **Back Country Leadership (Camping, Survival & Trail skills, 8th grade)** – This camp will feature basic camping skills combined with Trail skills including cooking, compass and geocaching.
- **WATER (Canoe Camp, 9th grade)** – This camp will emphasize canoeing, kayak, sail boating and proper water safety.
- **High Adventure (Survival Camp, 10th grade)** – This camp will emphasize boy led adult facilitated high action and energy tasks

HIGH TECH TRAIL:

- **HTC (2020) (Computer skills)** – This camp includes introduction into the 3 basic areas of computer technology which include, hardware, networking and applications.
- **HTC (2018) (Media skills)** – This camp includes the visual medium of motion pictures which include film production, camera work and editing.
- **HTC (2019) (Robotics)** – Robotic camp.

CRUCIBLE:

- Young Man may use attendance to the Crucible in place of 1 (one) advanced camp

ACADEMY EXIT CAMP:

- **Service (TASC)** – (11th grade TASC– The Academy Service Camp Designed to encourage servant leadership through personal growth. Learning real life skills to make a difference in your community and most importantly your church. Skills will include Altar Working, Search and Rescue, First Aid and CPR, and Security. This camp is held in June leading up to Pow-wow

At the completion of the five camps, you'll be presented a saber.

Tomahawk Achievement Camps

The Tomahawk Achievement Camps are designed to give Discovery Rangers and Adventure Rangers top notch training in camping skills. They will utilize the patrol system and learn to work as a team. There will be an adult advisor for each patrol. This camp will take place at the same time as The Academy. There will be a completely different staff specifically trained for the needs of boys of this age group.

Upon the successful completion of DTC 1, DTC 2 and ATC will be awarded a special Ceremonial Tomahawk specially made for TAC Graduates.
